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

#### P&O Cruises Announces Oriana Refurbishment

P&O Cruises has announced that Oriana will undergo an extensive refurbishment in Hamburg this November.

The ship, which has won many admirers over the years, will enter dry dock on 25 November 2016, following her return from the USA and Caribbean. According to P&O Cruises, the ship's most distinctive features will

be retained, with the comprehensive refit instead focusing on raising the standards of interior areas to those held across the fleet. Hospitality design specialists Richmond have been brought on board to oversee a refurbishment programme set to involve extensive updates to the ship's cabins, suites, entertainment areas, restaurants, bars and public areas. The

company was previously commissioned to create the interiors for P&O Cruises largest and newest vessel, Britannia.

Rich colour schemes, improved lighting, furniture upgrades and the replacement of all soft furnishings and carpets are planned for the vessel, whilst maintenance work will be carried out to bathrooms and balconies.



#### Celebrity Announces Autumn 2018 Debut For First Edge Ship

Celebrity Cruises has revealed that the first ship in its Edge-class fleet will debut in autumn 2018.

Despite remaining tight-lipped on the exact nature of its two newest ships – the second of which will debut in 2020 - the cruise line behind the term 'Modern Luxury' suggested that their arrival would "change the industry, like the Solstice-class ship did".

The claim was made by Vice President of Hotel Operations for Celebrity Cruises, Brian Abel, who was speaking at an exclusive event for trade partners and media in London. Abel also revealed that the line's two new Galapagos explorer ships – the 48-passenger Celebrity Xperience and 16-passenger Celebrity Xploration – will enter dry-dock at the end of the year, before joining the 100-person Celebrity Xpedition in the Galapagos Islands in 2017.







#### Silversea Plans \$170 Million Refurbishment

Silversea is to spend a record \$170 million on the largest fleet-wide refurbishment in its history.

Silver Whisper will become the first ship to undergo major redevelopment, with work scheduled for completion by the end of 2016, ahead of its 2017 World Cruise. Many of the planned changes have been influenced by feedback from previous World Cruise guests.

The refurbishment programme will also extend to Silver Wind, with a dry dock scheduled for October this year. Like Silver Whisper, the refurbishment of Silver Wind will also extend to both public areas and staterooms, along with technology upgrades including the introduction of interactive TVs and a vastly improved internet service. The ship's popular pool deck will be completely replaced, creating an area more akin to a luxury yacht than to a cruise ship.

Silversea's expedition vessel, Silver Discoverer, will also enter dry dock in October and it is in the ship's public areas where guests will see the most visible changes. The Restaurant will be remodelled, whilst the Discoverer Lounge will be reimagined from a breakfast venue to a sophisticated lounge area. New Audio Visual technology in the Explorer Lounge will enhance Silversea's luxury expedition experience.

"We are thrilled to be moving ahead with these major refurbishments and look forward to welcoming guests aboard and sharing our unique vision of ultra-luxury cruising, both in terms of service and physical environment", said Manfredi Lefebvre, Chairman of Silversea.

"We pride ourselves on being the reference when it comes to ultra-luxury cruising and this investment reflects our long-term commitment in this regard toward our ships, our guests and our crew".

#### Crystal Mozart Christened In Vienna

Crystal River Cruises has christened its first ever ship in Vienna.

The christening of Crystal Mozart took place on 11 July 2016 at Vienna's Millennium Pier; the home port of the river vessel. CEO of Crystal Cruises, Edie Rodriguez, welcomed guests in a statement which paid tribute to a 'historic milestone' for the world's most awarded luxury cruise line. Crystal Mozart becomes the first of seven ships planned for the brand new Crystal River Cruises fleet, with Crystal Bach and Crystal Mahler set to join Crystal Mozart in 2017. Regarding the fleet, Rodriguez said the ships will "set a new standard of excellence and comfort for all of Europe's Rivers,' before thanking all those involved for their tremendous efforts in making the day possible.

The traditional smash of a champagne bottle against the ship's hull was triggered by godmother Elisabeth Gürtler, who is widely respected for her role as the managing director of Vienna's famous Hotel Sacher.

Crystal Mozart has been entirely remodelled, having previously sailed as MS Mozart - the largest river ship in Europe - for the now obsolete German cruise line Peter Deilmann. The vessel is double the width of a typical river ship and marks a grand entrance into the river cruise market for Crystal River Cruises, bringing Crystal Cruises' award-winning service and luxury standards to Europe's rivers.





#### Celebrity Cruises To Sail The Caribbean Year-Round

Celebrity Cruises has announced plans for the award-winning Celebrity Equinox to sail year-round itineraries in the Caribbean.

Celebrity Equinox has previously repositioned to spend the summer period in the Mediterranean, but will remain in the Caribbean from 2017. Her passengers will have a choice of 24 cruises, with itineraries featuring both Eastern and Western Caribbean destinations. Sailings will include 7-night voyages between June and August, followed by 10 and 11-night itineraries throughout the remainder of the year. The cruise line will also introduce a range of new experiences and activities on board.

The first of Celebrity Equinox's Caribbean itineraries, all of which will depart from PortMiami, will be an 11-night voyage incorporating a two-night stay in New Orleans. The visit will coincide with the city's famous Jazz and Heritage Festival, beginning on 24 April 2017.

"Our guests, first-time cruisers and our travel partners have been asking me for many years to offer year-round Caribbean cruises. They wished we offered these itineraries," said Lisa Lutoff-Perlo, President and CEO of Celebrity Cruises.

"Affluent vacationers have been looking for summer cruises in the Caribbean and we felt this was a significant opportunity in our offering. So our new year-long sailings are perfect for discerning families and couples who want a summer getaway to sought-after tropical islands, with the best culinary experiences in the region and enriching activities for children and adults – all of which can only be offered by Celebrity. We are also adding new itineraries and sailings to create the most unforgettable vacations in the Caribbean; this is another example of what makes Celebrity so distinct and unique."

Lutoff-Perlo, added: "The response we have received so far to our year-round Caribbean sailings has been overwhelming, and we are excited to offer our guests endless summers in such a beautiful place."

Celebrity Cruises has also debuted a new culinary programme, Taste of the Caribbean, which will offer complimentary events for adults. Events include culinary demonstrations from Celebrity Cruises' featured chefs, mixology demos and a rum and reggae party on The Lawn Club. A number of additional, more exclusive events will also be available at a fee, including a fresh pasta and mozzarella making class with lunch in the Tuscan Grill and an exclusive five-course tasting dinner in the company of Celebrity Cruises chefs.

Finally, a Taste of the Caribbean Premium Package will offer guests absolute culinary indulgence throughout their time on board, from wine blending classes and comparison workshops, to a Chef Market Discovery shore excursion and more.

#### Arrival Of Two Crystal River Ships Delayed

Following the christening of its first river cruise ship, the 'reimagined' Crystal Mozart, Crystal River Cruises has announced its decision to delay the deployment of two of its brand new river vessels in France.

The new luxury river cruise line had previously revealed that the purpose built Crystal Debussy and Crystal Ravel would be ready to sail along the Seine, Rhone and Dordogne rivers in France in summer 2017. However, the decision has now been made to delay the deployment of the two ships, in order to prioritise offerings in the German and Austrian regions. The decision results in a year-long delay for the two ships, with their arrival pushed back to spring 2018 in order to accommodate their lengthening from 100 metres to 135 metres; the maximum size permissible on the Rhine, Main and Danube rivers to which they are now headed. The increase will allow both ships to now feature a swimming pool and sliding glass roof, along with larger passenger suites and the same 106 guest capacity as Crystal Bach

and Crystal Mahler.

According to the river cruise line, traveller demand was behind the change in deployment, with passenger feedback "lauding the itineraries planned in Germany, Austria, Belgium, Amsterdam and Holland".

Chief Executive and President Edie Rodriguez said: "Unlike an ocean-going ship that can accommodate a change in itinerary with short notice, a river ship operates within more confined parameters and is unable to re-route easily.

"We are listening carefully to what travellers are telling us and have concluded that the best way to anticipate, meet and surpass their expectations is by making this move earlier rather than later."

The line is offering a series of compensation packages to people who have booked 2017 voyages on Crystal Debussy and Crystal Ravel including on board credits and future cruise credits worth up to \$1,000.

The 2017 launch of both Crystal Bach and Crystal Mahler remains unchanged.

#### Hurtigruten Christens New Vessel Under Norway's Midnight Sun

Hurtigruten's new explorer vessel MS Spitsbergen has been christened in a ceremony held beneath the natural phenomenon of the Midnight Sun.

The fishing village of Svolvaer in Lofoten played host to the christening ceremony, a choice which recognised the location's importance as a highlight of Hurtigruten's Norwegian coastal voyages.

Speaking about the expedition cruise line's links with the village, Hurtigruten CEO Danial Skjeldam said: "Adventure travel is one of the fastest growing global tourism mega trends and Lofoten offers everything the new adventure traveller seeks: spectacular scenery, authenticity, a unique history and atmosphere, and access to active nature-based experiences. Svolvaer in many respects mirrors the modern Hurtigruten, being a world leading provider of explorer cruises with activity, learning and sustainability in the core."

The region's famous Midnight Sun cast a light over the MS Spitsbergen as the ship's godmother, Norwegian explorer Cecilie Skog, sent a champagne bottle smashing across the ship's hull. Skog is one of the most merited explorers of our time, with achievements including expeditions to the North Pole and South Pole, Mount Everest, Antarctica and Greenland under her wing. She

has also climbed the 'Seven Summits'

- the highest mountains on each of
the earth's seven continents – and was
considered the perfect representation for
Hurtigruten's adventurous ethos.

MS Spitsbergen joins Hurtigruten's fleet of explorer ships on Norway's coastline and sailed her first voyage from Bergen on 24 July 2016. After spending her first season in Norway, the vessel will alternate between the Norwegian coast and polar expeditions. From 2017, the

ship will sail to Greenland, Iceland, the Faroe and Shetland Islands, and Arctic Canada.

Magnus Zetterberg, UK Managing Director for Hurtigruten, commented: "This has been a big year for Hurtigruten, and with the christening of MS Spitsbergen, we are making headway towards becoming a world-leading adventure travel provider. We look forward to welcoming people from across the globe on board the new jewel in our ever-growing fleet."



#### Princess Cruises Reveals Key Features Of Majestic Princess

Princess Cruises has announced the design and key features of its newest ship, Majestic Princess.

The 3,560-passenger ship has been specially built for the burgeoning Chinese market but UK guests will have the opportunity to sail on board during a six week period in the Mediterranean, following her maiden voyage if the Adriatic Sea. Seven, 14, 21 and 28-day cruises will depart from Rome, Barcelona or Athens, before a repositioning voyage departs from Barcelona on Sunday 14 May 2017 to the ship's permanent homeport in Shanghai.

As the sister ship to Regal Princess and

Royal Princess, the Royal-class Majestic Princess will offer many of the same features including the Piazza atrium, the Princess signature SeaWalk, the popular Princess Live! TV Studio and the private dining experience. Chef's Table Lumiere

The ship will also boast several new and unique features, including Parisian bistrostyle dining at Le Bistrot and Chinese cuisine at the Harmony Cantonese Restaurant, created in partnership with Chef Richard Chen of 'Wing Lei'; the first Chinese restaurant in North America to be awarded a Michelin star. Other new dining options include the Leaves Tea Bar, Chopsticks Noodle Bar and Lobster Grill and Dim Sum Bar.

Majestic Princess will appeal to any shopaholic tendencies with almost 1,000 square metres of luxury boutiques from designers including Cartier, Bylgari and Chopard, Burberry and Gucci.

Jan Swartz, president of Princess Cruises said: "Over the past 50 years, we have developed a mastery of global travel delivering a truly international cruise holiday experience to our guests. With the debut of Majestic Princess, first in Europe and then in China, we invite guests to indulge in a new world-class experience that allows them to completely relax, unwind and ultimately 'come back new'."



#### Msc Cruises Reveals Features On New Ship Msc Meraviglia

With less than a year to go until the June 2017 launch of the first smart ship in MSC Cruises' Meraviglia class, the cruise line has revealed more details of its features.

The 5,700-passenger MSC Meraviglia will accommodate more guests than any other ship on the seas, including Royal Caribbean's Harmony of the Seas, and is set to wow guests with a host of new features.

MSC Cruises will extend its exclusive partnership with Cirque du Soleil, with shows performed twice every night, six nights per week, in the custom-built Carousel Lounge. The venue will also host a world-exclusive Cirque du Soleil dining and entertainment experience for up to 100 guests each evening.

MSC Meraviglia will also become the first ship in the fleet to combine the facilities for families, children and teens into one dedicated area, designed to offer a safe place for youngsters and somewhere for families to interact. The area will include a super amusement park and sports arena, family lounge, technology studio and kids club facilities in association with LEGO

and Chicco. Other family features will include the Aqua Park, a full-size bowling alley, virtual reality Formula 1 racing and a 'Himalayan Zipline' running the length of the ship.

MSC Meraviglia will incorporate ten different cabin types, including an enhanced Yacht Club spanning three decks and featuring 78 suites, 15 inside cabins and two apartments. The two apartments are set to become the most coveted accommodation on the ship and have been designed with a large living room and two balconies, one of which has a dining area and a private whirlpool. The ship will also feature modular cabins capable of being combined to accommodate up to 10 guests.

A vast Mediterranean-style promenade will become the heart of the ship, lit by an 80-metre LED sky and designed to incorporate shops and dining venues, as well as hosting the cruise line's famous pre-dinner parades.




#### Ed Sheeran Trades The A-Team For White Star Service







When we decided to run a feature on the USA, we faced a dilemma. How could we exclude Hawaii, a sunshine state scattered across the Pacific?
What about Alaska, whose landscapes are so epic, its glaciers alone are the size of whole US states.
And how could we talk of New England

without venturing north of the border into Canada too?

The truth is that, like those who visit America, we can only scratch the surface. An entire world is contained within the USA's 50 states, so much so that 64% of Americans reportedly don't own a passport. Why would they, with all of this on their doorsteps? Urban metropolises make it impossible to see the sky without

looking straight up. Fascinating ghost towns litter vast deserts, seemingly left behind by a world that never stops spinning. National parks are as big as nations and redwood forests are as tall as giants. The land of opportunity stretches as far as the eye can see and a cruise to some of its most popular ports of call encourages you to take a closer look. Here's where to start.



# CALIFORNIA Oreaming

California's certain kind of crazy was summed up perfectly by American author Edward Abbey. There may be no science, logic or reason behind the Golden State, even outside of La La Land, but what is promised on the rugged Pacific Coast are rousing cities, world-class vineyards, and sun, sand and surf in spades.

f you have seen it in the movies, you can almost certainly recreate it in California. Incarcerate yourself in Alcatraz, if only on a temporary basis. Flex little more than your inquisitive nature at Muscle Beach and stargaze at the Beverly Hills Hotel. Eat fish tacos from a truck on Hollywood Boulevard,

> stretch your legs on the hills of San Francisco and sip legendary vintages on the wine trails of Napa Valley.

The World Cruise Terminal, 25 miles south of Los Angeles in San Pedro, is the largest port on America's West Coast, with over a million people passing through its doors every year. Become one of them and you'll find yourself with a golden ticket to Tinseltown.

Los Angeles spreads itself across various neighbourhoods and each of them offers something totally unique. Hollywood is the land of the rich and famous, identifiable immediately by 9 giant white letters that have teetered on its hillsides since 1923. Venture here and you'll share the air with A-listers, all bleach blonde and beautiful, just straight from the silver screen too, including

the stars of the Walk of Fame, the waxworks of Madame Tussauds and the opulent oriental exterior of Grauman's Chinese Theatre, which having hosted not only more movie premieres than any other theatre but also several Academy Awards, has become known as the most famous cinema in the world. Of course, movie buffs can get their kicks at Universal Studios Hollywood too.

Just a hop, skip and jump from Hollywood is the equally exclusive Beverly Hills, where you'll find the world's best window shopping and people watching on Rodeo Drive. Make like Pretty Woman and kiss the cash goodbye, before walking the two blocks to Sprinkles, home of the world's first cupcake ATM stocked with freshly baked cakes, including their famous red velvet variety.



Nowhere sums up Old Hollywood nostalgia quite like Beverly Hills' most famous address, The Beverly Hills Hotel on Sunset Boulevard. The iconic hotel, affectionately known as the 'Pink Palace', blurs the line between the movies and real life; Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin and the rest of the Rat Pack spent many a boozy evening in its Polo Lounge, Charlie Chaplin was a regular and Elizabeth Taylor honeymooned there with six of her eight husbands.

Aside from Hollywood, Rodeo Drive and Beverly Hills, almost everything else you associate with Los Angeles can be found in one place at Venice Beach, from the brawn of Muscle Beach, to the street performers, roller skaters and skateboarders of the boardwalk. Despite stretching less than two miles along the Pacific Coast, this downtown neighbourhood epitomises the Los Angeles you see on screen.

Whilst LA almost always embodies a sunny disposition, San Francisco's take on the Californian weather tends to leave outsiders scratching their heads, especially when the fog rolls in like Tippex and erases everything between Alcatraz Island and the Golden Gate Bridge. Mother Nature certainly knows how to rain on your parade, particularly when you have spent hours hiking the Presidio Trail, based on the promise of a spectacular view of San Fran's most famous structure. However, stick around a while and the fog will lift, the International Orange of the bridge emerging in the picture perfect pose that never fails to delight the crowds.


If you're willing to make space in your case for an extra layer, San Francisco offers plenty to make braving its microclimate for an extended stay worthwhile. As far as American road trips go, the city is a starting point for some of the best; less than an hour will set you on the wine trails of Sonoma Country or Napa Valley, and the iconic coastal driving roads of the Big Sur are just a couple of hours outside of the city.

Head into the city and you'll find out what else sets it apart, other than its weather. After all, can you even say you've been to San Francisco if you haven't hired a bike at Fisherman's Wharf and cycled across the Golden Gate Bridge? You can save your legs and hop on



the aforementioned bicycle hire shacks and some really great grub, but you'll see a far more authentic side of the city if you head into the hills on the vintage seats of the F-Market streetcar. This historic line will take you to Market Street, from where you're within easy reach of some of the city's most notable neighbourhoods, including Haight-Ashbury and Alamo Square – home to the famous row of Victorian houses known as the Painted Ladies.

Hippies and hipsters aren't to be confused, though their penchant for a beard may suggest otherwise, but you'll encounter both breeds in equal measure at San Francisco's psychedelic Haight-Ashbury neighbourhood. Haight Street hit the headlines during the 1967 Summer of Love, when George Harrison and his Flower Children strolled its sidewalks, however the neighbourhood's rock 'n' roll associations don't end there; Haight-Ashbury's colourful Victorian abodes have played home to everyone from Jimi Hendrix and Janis Joplin, to Joni Mitchell and The Grateful Dead over the years. The neighbourhood remains a hippy epicentre today, its bohemian boutiques, craft beer bars and vintage stores

# Southern HOSPITALITY

There is something entirely different about America's southern states. It could be the extra coat of barbecue sauce lashed on their juicy rib ends, or the extra handful of cheese thrown in with the macaroni. It could be the way your Captain tips his hat and calls you "Ma'am" when he welcomes you aboard his Mississippi paddle wheeler. It could definitely be the music. Or it could be that what makes the Deep South so special is all of these things, thrown together in a huge mixing pot and dished up with a supersized side of southern hospitality.



t's hard to know what factors come into consideration when you're deciding exactly what makes somewhere 'the world's friendliest city' but, whatever it is, Charleston seems to have it in spades. Each year the top ten is released and each year this South Carolina city scoops the top spot.


Walking through Charleston feels like a stroll through a bygone era, so it doesn't come as too much of a surprise to learn that this is America's oldest city. The first shots of the Civil War were fired from Fort Sumter in Charleston Harbour and the entire Charleston Historic District is a living museum of American life in decades gone by, spanning over 500 acres and encompassing over a thousand buildings. Even those who would rather leave the history books in the classroom can't fail to be charmed by horse-drawn carriage tours of The Battery, the sugared almond houses of Rainbow Road, sunset sailings

on the vintage-style Schooner Pride and local artisanal wares sold in the centuries old surroundings of a City Market established in 1807.

Antebellum mansions set in acres of plantation land are synonymous with the southern states and Charleston has some of the very best, including one set in the suitably charming sounding town of Mount Pleasant. An almost mile-long driveway lined with 270-year-old oak trees makes for a grand entrance to the Boone Hall Plantation, but there's a sobering history behind one of the oldest plantations in America and the slave trade in which it once played a role.

Charleston may be one of America's oldest cities, but it is in fact New Orleans which features more Historic Districts on the National Register than any other in the US. The ultimate 'Old South' experience can be found less than an hour from the destination's popular French Quarter, and it is here that you will get a taste of Louisiana life. You can almost smell the sweet air and hear the rumble of wagon wheels as you meander along the River Road, where wealthy sugarcane planters built lavish homes on the banks of the Mississippi River.

Speaking of the French Quarter, few of its visitors realise that some of the best preserved 19th century architecture in the USA can be found here if you look beyond the bars. For example, Bourbon Street may be famed for its revelry, but it is a little known fact that the thoroughfare is as historic as it is hedonistic. That's not to say you shouldn't embrace the laissez-faire approach of a city made famous by the good times. They party hard here; endless barbecued food is



For those who cruise the Gulf of Mexico, time spent on the barrier island of Galveston is almost inevitable pre or post-cruise. There's relatively little here, aside from a visit-worthy historic downtown and the indoor tropical paradise of Moody Gardens, but it's the waterside town's close proximity to Houston that holds much of its appeal when it comes to extending your holiday.


A transfer of less than an hour will see you in the fourth-largest city in America and, whilst there's an underlying oil-rich history to Houston, there's not a hint of pretence to its favourite pastimes. This is the home of the World Barbecue Championships, the birthplace of Beyoncé and the host city of the 2017 Super Bowl. There's a firm focus on fun in Houston. After all, can you even call yourself a Texan tourist if you haven't experienced your first rodeo? And when you're in the place which broadcast man's first moments on the moon, why wouldn't you want to meet an actual astronaut at the Space Center Houston, before moving on to the NASA Johnson Space Centre to watch the engineers at work on new satellites and space suits?

The James Turrell Twilight Epiphany' Skyspace has quickly become another of the city's most popular attractions, with both tourists and locals heading to the Rice University campus for its sunrise and sunset light sequence displays. The art installation is mesmerising enough even to warrant the 5am wake-up call required in order to experience sunrise through the aperture of the hovering roof.

With a thriving foodie scene (one word – Tex-Mex!), a reputation as one of the world's great arts hubs and a world-class Theater District that, dare we say may even rival New York's Broadway, it's time to dig out those cowboy boots.







### THE AMERICAN DREAM



With year-round rays and some of America's best beaches, there's little wonder Mickey Mouse and his mates set up home here. Florida brings new meaning to fun in the sun and the only variable is where you find yours.

rlando is the undisputed theme park capital of the world. As the rightful home of escapism, it is here that thrill seekers and day dreamers will find Universal Studios Florida and the Islands of Adventure, plus The Wizarding World of Harry Potter which spans them both. And then of course, there is Walt Disney World, where the grown-ups slip on their mouse ears for the sake of the kids, only to find themselves equally enamoured by the characters, parades and firework displays; Disney's spell reaches far beyond the Magic Kingdom.

Of course, there's more to the destination than high-maintenance mice and movie

sets. Orlando is home to a slew of worldclass golf courses, over 170 in fact, and you never know which PGA pro you might run into on the eighth hole. The motorsports mecca of Daytona International Speedway is just over an hour's drive away too, and is an absolute must for motoring fans. The iconic track plays host to the legendary Daytona 500, the most important race on the NASCAR calendar, and those who aren't lucky enough to be in town to witness the February event itself can take advantage of the empty track on a Richard Petty driving experience.

In terms of speed, rockets take some beating. The Kennedy Space Centre is one of Orlando's top attractions and you'll find many excursions offered by cruise lines visiting Florida's Port Canaveral. It's worth checking the rocket launch schedule too; your trip may just coincide with the launch of a rocket from the Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. For the views minus the entry fee, head to Cocoa Beach; this sandy stretch

located just a few miles from Port Canaveral has become famous as the perfect vantage point for space shuttle launches over the ocean.

As the starting point for countless cruises to the Bahamas, the Caribbean and the Panama Canal, Fort Lauderdale's port is one the busiest in the world. It's also home to some seriously good beaches, thanks to its position on Florida's Gold Coast.

Fort Lauderdale's labyrinth of 300 inland

waterways has seen it nicknamed the 'Venice of America', but gondolas aren't the only way to explore these canals; duck boats, sightseeing yachts and the famous Jungle Queen riverboat are all on hand to get you within stalking distance of the extravagant mansions in the canal-side neighbourhood of Millionaire's Row, where little more than palm fronds sit between you and some of the grandest houses you've probably ever seen. Luxury also abounds at the palm tree-lined Las Olas Boulevard, where you'll find countless spots in which to sip a bottomless mimosa and watch the beautiful people of the Gold Coast come and go.

After the glitz and glamour of the Gold Coast, the swampy two-million-acre wilderness of the Everglades is a stark and enthralling contrast.

High style meets history in sexy South Beach, where you'll find yourself in the middle of Miami's emblematic Art Deco Historic District. Hotels and bars along the district's Ocean Drive and Collins Avenue were once frequented by stars including Clark Gable and Rita Hayworth, and whilst Park Central and the Clevelander remain Miami icons, it is the ultra-opulent Casa Casuarina that scoops the title of South Beach's most glamorous address. This lavish 1930s villa is famed as the one-time home of Gianni Versace, its notoriety only increasing when the fashion designer was assassinated on its steps. Today, Casa Casuarina has been reincarnated as one of the world's most exclusive hotels, with suites inside its storied surrounds setting guests back at least £750 a night

Of course, the Magic City has much to offer aside from South Beach. The Wynwood Arts District is one of the world's largest openair street art installations and promises something completely different to your usual art gallery experience. The former warehouse district is filled with quirky boutiques, antique shops and eclectic bars, but it is the murals of Wynwood Walls which make it a must visit.

As beguiling as Florida is when the sun shines, Miami in particular comes alive as the sun starts to set. The neon lights of Ocean Drive illuminate, sunset paints the sky purple and the sidewalks are awash with tanned skin, red parasols and colourful characters. If there's one place in the whole state that is deserving of an overnight stay, this is it.









ittle Havana is another of Miami's hottest districts, and for those who are patiently waiting for Cuban cruise itineraries to arrive on the agenda of mainstream operators, the neighbourhood should certainly appease in the meantime. Cubans have migrated to Florida since the 1950s and the Miami population is estimated to be 60% Hispanic, according to the United Nations. Because of this, Little Havana embodies an authentic Cuban spirit that is second only to the real Havana, rather than serving as little more than a tourist-friendly tribute act. The Cuban Quarter begins at Calle Ocho and whilst this is the commercial heart of the neighbourhood, you must make time to spread your wings and explore between its rainbow bright buildings too, preferably by tucking into chorizo hamburgers and plantain chips, or by nursing a Cuban coffee on route to Maximo Gomez Park; if your preconceptions of Cuba centre upon shirted old men squabbling over frantic rounds of dominos, you'll have them confirmed entirely here.

### THE AMERICAN DREAM

## EAST COAST COOL



CONCRETE JUNGLE YES, BUT ONE "WHERE DREAMS ARE MADE OF."

It is almost impossible to generalise America's East Coast. After all, how can you compare the skyscrapers of New York City with the seafood shacks of New England? And the excitement in the air around Times Square is a million miles away from the exclusive ambience surrounding the manicured mansions of Newport. Cruising the East Coast, during fall or otherwise, offers you the chance to draw your own comparisons.

ost East Coast explorers arrive via the Atlantic, their ships docking at the Brooklyn Cruise Terminal in Red Hook. In mere minutes, you are in Manhattan.

This is New York. Concrete jungle yes, but one "where dreams are made of", if the less than grammatically-correct lyrics of homegrown talents Alicia Keys and Jay-Z are to be believed. If you are chasing the American Dream, it is here that you head. It hides on the stages of Broadway and in the fashion studios of the Garment District; it waits for you at the top of the Empire State Building, tempting you with enough of a view to guarantee that New York never wanders far from your thoughts again. Spend a New York Minute and you'll pray that time stands still long enough for you to rack up a lifetime in the city that never sleeps.

It's hard to put your finger on what makes the Big Apple so appealing, but when you're rowing a boat on Central Park Lake, with the sun on your back and the city's skyscrapers rising around you, there's no denying that it is something

seriously special. The same feeling creeps in when you join the tourist masses in Times Square and find yourself awestruck amongst the billboards, and you'll sense it as you wander through the West Village, surrounded by the kind of people who are so impossibly cool, they'd look right at home in the movies set on those same streets. Eat pizza at Grimaldi's and steak at Peter Luger, drop some serious dollar on Fifth Avenue and watch your own West Side Story develop from the High Line. All of the above are rites of passage for first time visitors and they leave a lot for the rest of the East Coast to live up to.

Fewer than 200 miles separate New York City and Newport in Rhode Island, but the two couldn't be further apart. Whilst New York is an epicentre of modern life, Rhode Island built its homes and its reputation on old money. It is on these New England shores that America's Nouveau Riche, including





the Vanderbilts, spent their summers and their vast palatial residences remain as a reminder of the Gilded Age. Tours to these unapologetically ostentatious holiday homes always incorporate two Vanderbilt residences within their rounds; The Breakers and the Marble House, and these are the grandest of all eleven Newport mansions.

Newport's attraction continued long after the Vanderbilts left town (with the exception of a great-granddaughter who continues to summer rent-free on the third floor of The Breakers), and much of its appeal centres around the sea. Rhode Island is known as the Ocean State, and there are over 100 beaches along its 400-mile coast; not bad for a state measuring just 38 miles wide and 48 miles long. Every Newport town is bordered by a beach and there are few simpler pleasures than watching the Atlantic Ocean crash onto the sands, whilst you manoeuvre your mouth around a lobster roll. One of the best, Easton's Beach, delivers sea food and sea views in equal measure, and is also the starting point for windswept strolls along the jaw-dropping Newport Cliff Walk.

Of course, you cannot cruise New England without visiting Boston and walking a different kind of path. The Freedom Trail is the most historic two-and-a-half miles in America, its 16 sites all having played a significant role in the American Revolution. With entry to 13 of the sites provided free of charge, the 2.5-mile route is arguably one of the city's most popular attractions.

Boston has a reputation for being hip and historic in equal measure, and you'll find plenty to do aside from the Freedom Trail.

Boston Common is regularly compared to New York's Central Park, despite having been established over 200 years before its leafy counterpart in 1634, and is the oldest public park in America. If the park looks strangely familiar, along with the Beacon Hill neighbourhood which sits on its outskirts, it is because both have played a starring role in some of Hollywood's biggest Boston-based blockbusters, including The Departed and Good Will Hunting. Beacon Hill's Bull & Finch Pub is instantly recognisable to many, having served as the exterior of the famous Cheers bar.

The only green space for which Boston is more famous is the iconic emerald turf of Fenway Park; home of the Boston Red Sox and the oldest baseball park in Major League. The charm of Fenway Park is that it looks much the same today as it did when it opened in 1912 and you needn't be a sports fan to appreciate the thrill that comes with sitting on the stadium's slatted wooden seats, singing along to Sweet Caroline during the seventh-inning stretch. Of course, those who are sports fans will already know that Boston is home to NFL's Super Bowl winning giants, the New England Patriots, too.

For all the greatness of America's East Coast cities, it is New England's nature that attracts many to this part of the world. Bar Harbor, despite being little more than a tiny fishing town on the coast of Maine's Mount Desert Island, is a big hitter in the world of cruising. Mountains, lakes, woodland and wildlife have drawn holidaymakers to Bar Harbor and the surrounding Acadia National Park for centuries, and the jewel in Maine's crown hasn't dulled its sparkle since the days when the Astors and Rockefellers would frequent its island estates. It was John D Rockefeller Jr. who laid the 47 miles of rocky Carriage Roads that today allow some three million visitors to visit Acadia National Park every year. Walk the roads in a New England fall and you'll find yourself surrounded by shades of rust, russet, evergreen and ochre, the colours created by a forest of birch, aspen, spruce and firs.

Besides the foliage, New England's claim to fame is its seafood, and whilst you'll find chowder, clambakes and more on the menu, the real star of the show is the Maine lobster. Take a seat at a gingham covered table and tuck your serviette into the collar of your shirt, before jumping whole-heartedly into a feast of lobster bisque, lobster rolls, broiled lobster casserole and poached lobster tails. Bar Harbor is as passionate about its lobster as Bubba Gump was about his shrimp.





## GRAPES OF AMERICA





When the morning fog rolls into San Francisco, an escape across the Golden Gate Bridge and through Northern California's Wine Country will warm you from the inside out.

little over forty years ago, Napa Valley and Sonoma County each consisted of just a handful of relatively young wineries and it was French wines which ruled the world. That is until 24 May 1976, when the 1976 Judgement of Paris saw a Bordeaux and Burgundy from two scarcely known Californian wineries triumph over their French counterparts in a blind tasting (performed by France's most renowned wine experts, no less). The result shocked the wine world and put California up there with the world's greatest wine regions.

Today, America is the fourth-largest wine producing country in the world and 89% of those wines are produced in California. The fog that blights the mornings of San Franciscans is welcomed wholeheartedly on California's North Coast, where it acts as a natural air conditioning system to cultivate exceptional Chardonnay and Pinot Noirs.

The 1973 Chateau Montelena Chardonnay was the winning white at the Judgement of Paris and the Chateau Montelena Winery has since become a star of the Napa Valley wine trail. Head to the stone chateau's tasting rooms and you'll find several mementos of the victory, including a bottle of the winning white, a congratulatory telegram from France and various newspaper clippings proclaiming the triumph.

Of course, the Chateau Montelena Winery is but one of over 400 wineries in Napa Valley, which sits just 50 miles northeast of San Francisco and is within such easy reach of the city that you can almost smell the bouquet from the bay. Stag's Leap, Clos du Val, Spring Mountain Vineyard, Freemark Abbey and Heitz Wine Cellars complete the six history makers behind the victorious vinos of 1976, and whilst they are scattered enough around the valley to warrant driving, Napa Valley tradition demands that you hire a bicycle in order to really make the most of the idyllic hillsides and winding roads which separate each sprawling estate.

Those who are yet to ditch the stabilisers will be happy to hear that there are countless ways to see Napa Valley. Rainbow bright hot air balloons can be seen soaring above the vineyards, lakes and mountains







wine pairings, so we'll leave it up to you to decide whether to dig deep or wait until your next Seabourn sojourn.

If Napa Valley is the older, more sophisticated sister, Sonoma County is its bohemian, free-spirited sibling. The somewhat ceremonial wine tastings of Napa are replaced with a far more casual affair in Sonoma, to the extent that the person pouring your sometimes free tipples is often the same person who produced them. The restaurants are rustic, delivering big flavour with small time charm, and the wineries are dotted between antique markets and vintage boutiques.


Sonoma County stretches from the Pacific Ocean in the west to the Mayacamas Mountains in the east, and whilst there are over 200 wineries here, only 6% of the county is vineyard. What this means for visitors is that there is plenty to do between whetting your whistle. The county incorporates over 50 miles of Pacific Ocean coastline, including a spot on the world-famous Highway 1; an American road trip favourite. Bodega Head, part of Sonoma Coast State Park, is a prime whale watching spot, whilst Armstrong Redwoods State Park is just a few miles inland and invites you to walk amongst the tallest living things on our planet, the giant sequoia trees.

If you have wine on your mind, a tasting at the oldest commercial winery in

California is a must. The Buena Vista Winery was founded in 1857, long before the 1976 Judgement of Paris put the region onto the radar of oenophiles, and the designated Historic Landmark is just 5 minutes from Sonoma Plaza in the heart of the town. Explore the winery's labyrinth of barrel-filled tombs followed by a tasting in the Grand Reserve, enjoy a tasting flight in the Historic Press House Tasting Room or have them rustle up an artisanal picnic of local produce to enjoy in the winery's gorgeous shaded grounds.

Hire a car, take the train, catch the ferry or board a bus, but whatever it takes to get there, just make sure your San Francisco stopover includes a visit to Northern

California's Wine Country.



What does the Regent Suite on board the Seven Seas Explorer, have in common with the £13,000-a-night Royal Suite at The Savoy in London?

he answer is the Savoir No.1 bed, a bespoke creation of Mongolian goat cashmere and bred-for-purpose horse tail, built at a cost of £112,000 and 120 man hours, and apparently so special that The Savoy bought out its manufacturer in the 1920s in order to guarantee exclusivity.

What we do know is that after years of anticipation and bold, some may say brash claims, Regent Seven Seas Cruises have silenced the doubters with a glittering reveal of what does indeed appear to be 'the most luxurious ship ever built'. Rumour has it that Del Rio gave designers a single image to work with when it came to creating

getting those finishing touches just right is always difficult too; before you know it, your search for the perfect accent piece has led to not one or two, or even three Picassos, but four, plus a £190,000 limited-edition Steinway Arabesque piano. That's just the way it goes when your heart is set on delivering something really special.







It takes a lot to make a £30,919 cruise price tag any less eyewatering, but if you compare the price of slumbering on the No.1 bed during a 10-night Seven Seas Explorer cruise, against the cost of bunkering down for the same duration at The Savoy, it almost seems like a bit of a bargain.

Not that 'bargain' is a word that should ever be associated with the Seven Seas Explorer, the budget which was set at £340 million, making it the most expensive cruise ship at sea on a cost per berth basis. That budget was exceeded of course, though by how much is anybody's guess; Frank Del Rio, President and CEO of Norwegian Cruise Holdings, refused to put a number on it.

the Seven Seas Explorer. Torn from the pages of a magazine, the image depicted a corridor in a luxury hotel, and was chosen by Del Rio for its timeless appeal. This is how he anticipated that the first new Regent Seven Seas Cruises ship in 13 years should look.

Only, like any avid DIY enthusiast at home will know, decorating projects have a habit of spiralling out of control when you have a certain look in mind. One minute you are umming and ahhing over paint swatches, the next you are having a £380,000 modern interpretation of a Tibetan prayer wheel installed, complete with an entire reinforced deck to support its almost three-ton weight. And

Seven Seas Explorer is well into her inaugural season now, having been christened in a suitably dazzling ceremony in Monte Carlo (where else?). With a Primat of Veuve Clicquot sent crashing against the ship's hull by the snip of scissors held by Her Serene Highness Princess Charlene of Monaco, new heights of luxury were released to the seas. The champagne-fuelled proceedings were drawn to a fitting close with a private performance given by Italian tenor, Andrea Bocelli.

The christening ceremony may well have become the benchmark against which all others will be set, but it is the numbers behind the Seven Seas Explorer which are most impressive.

It's not the destination but the journey that matters' is a quote used time and time again to describe cruising. But what happens when the journey terrifies you?

t starts with sweaty palms and clammy skin, escalating to a pounding in your chest and a rising sense of panic that churns in your stomach, like a white load on a spin wash. Rumour has it that Aretha Franklin's fear of flying developed overnight and led to her missing out on the opportunity to perform for Her Majesty the Queen of England. Actor Sean Bean famously drove to all of his European film locations, until his role in The Lord of the Rings forced him to face his fears and fly to New Zealand, where he still refused to join the rest of the cast on

helicopter transfers. The late David Bowie's fear of flying saw him develop a longlasting love of cruising during the 60s and 70s, with stories shared of his impromptu performance of Space Odyssey on board Canberra. The legendary artist continued his love affair with P&O Cruises throughout the years, preferring the relaxed pace of cruising to the stress of air travel. Even rock stars have embraced cruising as a way to side step their fear of flying; Blink 182 drummer, Travis Barker, is one of the many famous faces to have sailed on board Cunard's Queen Mary 2 in recent years, his own involvement in a plane crash having instilled an intense fear of flying. Even today, the star continues to travel by cruise ship to all of the band's European engagements, often opting for the luxury of Cunard's Princess Grills.

Cruising is a revelation for those whose fear of flying is beyond repair. When everything from soothing the anxiety with meditation and breathing techniques, to seeking professional help from psychotherapists and hypnotists has failed, cruising becomes the only way to see the world without a hint of stress.

For years, many thought cruising could only take you as far as the Mediterranean or Northern Europe, perhaps even to the Caribbean at a push. Today's reality is that





there are few places in the world which are beyond the reach of a cruise ship. > It can be hard work enticing teenagers away from their PlayStations, which is why the teen-only hideouts on board are so popular. There's plenty to keep them entertained, including all of those technological devices today's kids can't imagine life without, but whether they can hideaway here on days in port depends on which cruise line you are travelling with. Some, such as Royal Caribbean International and Carnival Cruises, do offer what they deem to be a babysitting service, meaning that your teens could kick back on board whilst you go ashore and on excursions. In this case, the kids club staff will take details of your excursion, so that

they can contact the appropriate person should you be needed back on the ship in case of emergency. It is worth noting that joining excursions which are not arranged via the cruise line will make it really difficult for someone to locate you and let you know of any issues.

Not all operators allow parents and guardians to leave children on board. For example, P&O Cruises operates a strict policy stating that children aged 16 and under must not be left on board unaccompanied under any circumstances. Speak to your Sales Consultant at Bolsover Cruise Club to check the policy of your chosen cruise line.





Since booking our first cruise holiday, my husband has been diagnosed with quite a serious medical condition. His doctor has signed him off as fit to travel, but I am worried about what would happen if he were to be taken ill miles away from land. Can you put my mind at ease?

> Sorry to hear that your husband isn't well; it sounds like you both need a holiday!

I hope that it will put your mind at rest to know that every cruise ship has its own medical centre on board, which is staffed by fully qualified doctors and nurses. These medical staff are on hand 24/7, treating everything from dodgy tummies to broken bones, but they are also on hand should a more serious medical emergency occur whilst the ship is at sea. In many cases, the medical team will keep a more poorly passenger safe and comfortable until they reach the next port. However, it is sometimes necessary to arrange for those who are exceptionally ill to be airlifted from the ship to the nearest port, something known as a medevac.

In short, your husband is in good hands at sea. However, there are two important factors to address before you cruise. Firstly, you must advise your cruise operator of your husband's medical requirements. Secondly, I cannot stress how important it is that your husband is properly insured to travel. Treatment on the ship is costly enough, but a medevac can stretch into tens of thousands of pounds. Dedicated cruise insurance is an absolute must, as is declaring his pre-existing medical conditions to your insurer. Yes, it will push up your premium a little, but it will save you some serious money and stress in the unfortunate event of your husband being taken ill whilst on holiday.



My partner and I are complete foodies, and we have been considering a food themed cruise for our next holiday. Is this something which is widely available and could you make any recommendations?



Elsewhere, Memphis Blues is brought to the seas by an eight-piece band in B.B. King's Blues Club, their dulcet tones and raucous renditions supplemented by suitably sweet-sounding speciality cocktails, like 'Rock the Baby' and 'Lucille'.

Late in the morning, a string quintet rehearses for its afternoon recital on the Lincoln Center Stage, a handful of listeners shunning shore excursions to appreciate the performance; coffees in hand, of course. Such appreciation was anticipated by Holland America Line's Cruise Director, Johnathan Rogers, who spoke about the arrival of such an esteemed centre of the arts as something of a game changer, saying: "What we've done with classical music has really raised the bar, because there is nothing like it in the cruise industry". President of the cruise line, Orlando Ashford, shared his excitement, saying; "Classic music has been one of the many hallmarks of a Holland America Line Cruise, and to partner with an organisation as esteemed as the Lincoln Center takes our programme to an entirely new level. We are excited about this opportunity and look forward to bringing the best of this musical genre to guests."

Performances on the Lincoln Center Stage are not all that is classic about the Koningsdam. Holland America Line suggested that the first ship in its new Pinnacle Class would carry forward decades of tradition and heritage, yet merge it seamlessly with contemporary touches. The result is a ship that is lighter and brighter than others in the fleet. Antiques have been replaced with modern artworks, many of them musically themed. Where dark woods are used, they are sleek and polished, the light flooding in from the decks above, the way it would through the f-hole of a Stradivarius violin.

An abundance of sophisticated vino shades pours through many of the ship's public areas, aside from the blue and white Delftware colour scheme of the charming Grand Dutch Café; one of our favourite spots on board and reportedly one of Adam D. Tihany's too. In the World Stage, traditional decor lulls theatregoers into a false sense of security, leaving them shaken to their core when performances and productions explode with state-of-the-art lighting, projections and sounds, not to mention a high definition 270-degree LED screen which wraps around the room and immerses its occupants in the heart of the action.

When it comes to dining, whether for


free or for a fee, the choices aboard Koningsdam are as plentiful as the portions. Tuck into fruits de mer, moules and bouillabaisse beneath the accordionlike wooden beams of laidback a la carte brasserie, Sal de Mer, or head to the moody Tihany-designed Pinnacle Grill, where Pacific North West cuisine is served to tables decorated with Frette linens, Riedel glassware and Bvlgari china. There's a feast for the senses and the appetite alike in the Dining Room, where silence falls aside from the satisfied groans that come only from a really good meal - tuck into a seafood platter with midori gelée and champagne ginger dressing, followed by the best beef tenderloin you've possibly ever eaten. Enormous ribs of white reach above diners in vast arches and glass globes in various shades of gold, white and red hang in droplets from the ceiling. However, the real star of the show is the wine tower; a sweeping, glimmering, copper crescendo that soars from floor to ceiling and is filled in its entirety by great vintages.

Koningsdam sings from the same hymn sheet as those who crave classic cruising, where service is paramount, afternoons are leisurely, evenings are refined and there isn't a waterslide in sight. The modern touches are there – USB charging ports in contemporary staterooms, an ultra-sleek spa and the first ever purpose-built wine blending venue at sea – but the overriding feeling is that Holland America Line has succeeded in entering a new era, without compromising the romance of ocean-going travel. And for that, they should take a bow.
