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

JET SET SAIL RETURNS TO LONDON STANSTED

Celebrity Cruises has confirmed that its Jet Set Sail programme will return to London Stansted for a third year in 2018.

The VIP air charter service operates from Stansted Airport's Inflite Private Jet Terminal and will deliver guests to join Celebrity Constellation throughout its summer season in the Mediterranean, where it will cruise 7-11 night itineraries from Barcelona, Rome and Venice, with destinations including Florence, Ibiza and Palma de Mallorca.

Features of the Jet Set Sail upgrade include complimentary valet parking, access to the exclusive Celebrity Cruises departure lounge and a private charter flight aboard a Titan Airways B737-300 with a luggage allowance of 25kg. Transfers and priority embarkation at the ports are also included.





LOEN SKYLIFT OPENS IN NORWAY

The Loen Skylift has opened in Norway.

Billed as the world's steepest cable car, the Skylift will carry visitors over 3,300ft up Mount Hoven in just five minutes, providing panoramic views of the stunning Nordfjord region.

Loen Skylift will operate all year round and will provide access to hiking trails, climbing routes, winter sports facilities and fine dining at the summit of Mount Hoven. The Hoven Restaurant will offer panoramic views overlooking Mt. Skåla and Lake Lovatnet in the east, Jostedalsbreen Glacier and Olden in the south, and the Nordfjord that winds its way towards Stryn in the west.

Hoven Loen is located just 10 minutes from the Port of Olden and will also be offered by some cruise lines as an excursion from Geiranger.

MULTI-MILLION MAKEOVER FOR PACIFIC PRINCESS

The smallest ship in the Princess Cruises fleet has received a multi million-pound refurbishment.

Pacific Princess spent two weeks in dry dock and the resulting modernisation includes refreshed guest areas, four renovated dining venues, 178,000 square feet of new carpet and the Princess livery on her hull.

All 336 staterooms now include the line's signature Princess luxury beds and linens, as well as new carpets, headboards, draperies, lighting and USB ports. Sleeper sofas have been placed in suite staterooms as well as desks, lounge chairs and



dining room sets.

The ship's atrium has been upgraded with a New York City hotel design, while the ship's pool deck has a garden theme, featuring modernised tiling and refinished teak woods. New lounge furniture includes double bed loungers and casual seating groups of outdoor living sofas, lounge chairs and pool chaises.

The ship is currently sailing various European itineraries from Dover before departing on an 111-day World Cruise from Los Angeles on 20 January 2018.



ROYAL CARIBBEAN'S TOTAL ECLIPSE CRUISE GOES ON SALE

Royal Caribbean has launched a Total Eclipse Cruise ahead of the rare natural phenomenon taking place next summer.

Oasis of the Seas will follow the eclipse path over the course of a seven-night sailing in the eastern Caribbean. The cruise will cover 20-27 August, with the total eclipse taking place on 21 August 2018. A viewing party is planned for the evening of the eclipse, with a live concert by a 'major headliner' who will be revealed at a later date. Other activities planned include eclipsethemed parties, lectures, interactive science for children and cosmic-themed refreshments. Michael Bayley, Royal Caribbean's president and chief executive, said: "A total solar eclipse hasn't crossed the entire US since 1918, and with many of our ships sailing the Caribbean along the projected path, the stars aligned.

"Oasis of the Seas will have the vantage point of the century and an unforgettable celebration out at sea that adventurers won't want to miss."

The Eastern Caribbean cruise departs from Orlando and visits St Maarten, St Thomas and Nassau.

Specialists chosen from some of Europe's most celebrated wineries will be on hand to share their wisdom and invite guests to sample the wares of their privatelyowned vineyards in France, Greece, Italy and Spain.

Celebrity Cruises will also be offering exclusive excursions with The Wine Show's resident wine experts Joe Fattorini and Amelia Singer, with the duo joining various sailings this autumn. NEWS

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QUEEN MARY 2 RESCUES STRICKEN SAILOR

Cunard flagship Queen Mary 2 has come to the rescue of a sailor left stranded in the north Atlantic when his yacht was damaged in a storm.

Former Marine Mervyn Wheatley, 73, was taking part in a transatlantic race from Plymouth to Newport, Rhode Island in the US when his boat was battered by heavy wind and waves in the early hours of 9 June 2017.

The UK Coastguard and counterparts in Halifax, Canada, launched a long-range rescue mission involving an RAF C-130 Hercules after detecting a distress beacon. The Hercules crew told him via radio that QM2 was close by and Wheatley joked that he would rather be picked up by the liner if he had a choice.

QM2 lowered a rescue boat and crew of three to the aid of the stricken sailor, who had sailed across the Atlantic 19 times, eight times single-handedly, but had never been on a cruise ship before.

Speaking to The Times from QM2, on which he had been given a Princess Grill suite, Wheatley said: "I may be a little less snooty about cruise ships now!"

SYMPHONY OF THE SEAS LEAVES DRY DOCK

Royal Caribbean's newest ship Symphony of the Seas has entered the next stage in its construction after leaving dry dock.

The new Oasis-class ship was floated out on 9 June 2017, with the construction of the ship's interiors now underway.

When launched in spring 2018, Symphony of the Seas will be the largest cruise ship ever built. The ship will offer similar features to sister ship Harmony of the Seas, including the Bionic Bar, various neighbourhoods and Ultimate Abyss, the tallest slide at sea.

The ship will sail an inaugural summer season in the Mediterranean, before homeporting in Miami from early November to begin seven-night eastern and western Caribbean itineraries.

MSC MERAVIGLIA IS CHRISTENED BY GODMOTHER SOPHIA LOREN

MSC Meraviglia was christened in Le Havre, France, on 3 June 2017 by silver screen legend Sophia Loren.

At 171,598 gross tonnes and with a guest capacity of 5,714, MSC Meraviglia is the largest in the MSC Cruises fleet and is the cruise line's new flagship.

"We have an ambitious vision for the future and MSC Meraviglia marks the start of the second phase of growth for our company," said Pierfrancesco Vago, MSC Cruises' Executive Chairman. "For this reason, this is an extremely proud moment for all of us at MSC Cruises as we see the first of our next-generation ships being named."

"The new ships that we are building between 2017 and 2020 alone, we will receive six new ships - are purpose-built, featuring innovation in both product and design, as well as the very latest cutting-edge marine and consumerfacing technology to create unforgettable holiday experiences at sea for guests of all ages. MSC Meraviglia is the first to make this vision come to life, as it sets a new standard for cruise ships as a destination in itself."



The christening ceremony was hosted by comedian Gad Elmaleh and saw performances by internationally renowned singer Patrick Bruel and UNICEF Goodwill Ambassadors, Kids United. Following a parade of the ship's officers, Sophia Loren cut the ribbon and christened MSC Meraviglia with the smash of a champagne bottle and a crescendo of fireworks. Sophia Loren has held a close relationship with MSC Cruises for over a decade, since becoming the godmother of MSC Lirica in 2003. She has since blessed every new ship in the fleet.

MSC Meraviglia will spend its inaugural season in the Mediterranean. Itineraries are on sale now.

BOUDICCA BEGINS 2017/18 CRUISE SEASON FROM LIVERPOOL

Fred Olsen's Boudicca has commenced its cruise season from Liverpool, sailing from the world-famous Pier Head.

We caught up with Leon Hand, Brand Training Manager at Celebrity Cruises, to find out all about his recent once-in-alifetime trip to the Galápagos Islands. Adventurers and animal lovers, this one is for you.

LEON, THANKS FOR CHATTING WITH INTO THE BLUE.

I THINK EVERYONE SHARES A SENSE OF INTRIGUE WHEN IT COMES TO THE GALÁPAGOS ISLANDS. HAVING EXPERIENCED THE REGION FIRST HAND, COULD YOU TELL US WHAT A TYPICAL DAY THERE IS LIKE?

WAS LUCKY ENOUGH to be sent to the Galápagos Islands with Celebrity Cruises, with the aim of being able to share my first-hand experience of this amazing and still largely undiscovered area of the globe with customers and travel agent partners alike.

I spent a week sailing on Celebrity Xpedition, which is a 100 berth mega-yacht. The ship is a comfortable and luxurious home-fromhome and the perfect base from which to explore the Galápagos Islands in depth.

Each day offers a chance to discover not one but two ports of call, so it is an active and sometimes hectic schedule; this certainly isn't the kind of holiday on which you do nothing but chill out and relax! A sumptuous buffet breakfast precedes the first port of the day and guests normally disembark at around 9.30-10am, travelling on a high-tech zodiac boat to explore one of the 13 islands that Celebrity Cruises visit. Each zodiac takes a maximum of 14 passengers, so the groups are nice and small. Of course, an experienced and qualified Galápagos National Park naturalist guide is in charge for the whole shore experience.

Each shore excursion lasts about two hours; we had one in the morning and one in the afternoon, with a delicious lunch in between, either in the main restaurant or at the Beagle Grill up on the main deck outside, where we enjoyed freshly barbequed chicken, steak or seafood.





A choice of mild or active excursions are offered in each port of call. These can be a combination of snorkelling, hiking and swimming, or even just sunbathing and enjoying walks along the beach!

There are plenty of chances to go snorkelling and spend time in the gorgeous waters of the Pacific, getting to know the bright and beautiful rare marine life, and - if you are lucky – meeting one of the cheeky and playful sea lions. You are kitted out at the very beginning of the cruise with your own wetsuit and snorkelling gear.

Evening time on board is very chilled and relaxed. Every single night at 6.30pm, everyone gathers in the main lounge for a full and detailed brief from the Cruise Director on what to expect the following day. This lasts for about 20 minutes and you are provided with pictures of the wildlife native to that island or port of call, full maps and routes for any walks or hikes, plus lots of interesting information to whet the appetite and excite your sense of adventure and discovery. After the brief, you are then required to sign up for your choice of excursion - whether active or mild – for both morning and afternoon. It is all very well-organised, leaving you nothing to worry about except what to choose to have for dinner that evening!

YOU MENTION THAT CELEBRITY CRUISES GUESTS HAVE A CHOICE OF EXCURSIONS EACH MORNING AND AFTERNOON ON MANY OF THE ISLANDS. DO THESE INCLUDE DIFFERENT OPTIONS TO CATER FOR VARYING LEVELS OF FITNESS?

As mentioned before, the great thing is that there is an excursion for all types, tastes and levels of fitness. I chose the active option each time as I love walking, hiking and running. However, the mild options were mainly close-up sightseeing from the comfort of a zodiac boat, followed or preceded by a gentle walk along the beach or some wildlife sighting.

There are also options on some of the larger islands, such as Santa Cruz or Isabela, to visit wildlife centres, museums and markets. Many of my fellow passengers were aged 60 years or over and I struggled at times to keep up with them!

Also, don't forget that the 7-night Galápagos cruise is preceded by an amazing two-night stay in Quito, the stunning and fascinating capital of Ecuador. This is a unique colonial city, well preserved and offering lots to see and do. It has UNESCO World Heritage status and a visit here with Celebrity Cruises is an incredibly immersive experience, as it includes a full day tour with meals, as well as very friendly and experienced local guides, who are always there to look after you and escort you to and from the airport when you are transferring to or from the Galápagos Islands.

That is a very good question, as I – like many – am a good swimmer but a novice snorkeler. The team on board advise everyone that those who are newer to snorkelling should stick to shallower waters, whilst those who are more experienced in snorkelling can go for a good dive and spend half-an-hour or so exploring the dazzling world beneath the waves.

Whichever category you fall into, it is just incredible to watch the rare and brilliantly coloured marine life that can only be found in the Galápagos.





THE GALÁPAGOS ISLANDS ARE HOME TO OVER 1,900 UNIQUE SPECIES, SOME OF WHICH ARE CREDITED WITH INSPIRING CHARLES DARWIN'S THEORY OF NATURAL SELECTION. WHAT WILDLIFE DID YOU ENCOUNTER DURING YOUR OWN TIME THERE?

Each island has hidden treasures and delightful surprises in terms of the flora and fauna that the Galápagos are famous for.

I was not disappointed at any time, when it came to viewing up close all my favourites, such as the blue-footed booby (a colourful and entertaining bird and very rare too -80% of the world's population live in the Galápagos Islands) and the infamous marine iguana; the only reptile in the world to have, over millions of years, evolved and adapted to its harsh surroundings. They have learned how to hold their breath and dive deep down to the ocean floor to forage for food. The highlight of the wildlife sightings for me were the giant Galápagos tortoises. On the island of Santa Cruz, which is the most highly populated of the five inhabited islands, you can see many wild giant tortoises roaming free in the highlands, up in the mountains and even along the island's only main road in and out of the town! These creatures are incredible to see. They are huge in size, seem very happy and live for over a hundred years in most cases.

Santa Cruz is a must on any Galápagos itinerary. More than 20,000 people live in its biggest town, Puerto Ayora, which incidentally is where Celebrity Cruises feature the hotel and activity programme for our brand new three-night post-cruise stay.

FINALLY, WHAT STANDS OUT AS THE MOST MEMORABLE MOMENT OF YOUR TRIP TO THE GALÁPAGOS ISLANDS?

So many experiences during my time there were unforgettable and magical, but if 1 had to narrow them down, 1 would say the following:

- > Spending time in Quito, which is such an intriguing yet friendly and modern place. I loved the two-night pre-cruise stay, as it was almost like a mini holiday before the main cruise holiday began.
- > Seeing the giant tortoises up close in the nature reserve on Santa Cruz and finding out that the word 'galapago' means 'saddle' in Spanish. The islands are named after these tortoises, as their upturned shell reminded the Spaniards of a horse's saddle.
- > Participating in a tree-planting/ reforestation programme with local farmers.

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WINTER WARNERS

When it comes to winter sun without the long-haul flight, the Canary Islands steal the show. Despite being just hours away from the UK, the Canaries couldn't differ more in terms of winter weather. Hot all year around, with dramatic landscapes, great beaches and delicious local cuisine, these volcanic islands found off the western coast of Africa are just the ticket for a winter cruise. Read on for our suggestions on how to spend a day in some of the Canaries' most popular ports of call.



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TENERIFE


Tenerife is the largest of the Canary Islands, its skyline dominated by the gargantuan Mount Teide and its coast crammed with a combination of lively resorts and sleepy hillside villages. Historic Santa Cruz is Tenerife's main port but many make the trip south to cosmopolitan Costa Adeje and the popular Playa de las Americas, too.



It takes just 8 minutes to reach the summit of Mount Teide by cable car but you'll want much longer than that to take in the views from the top. The volcano is the third tallest in the world and the highest point in all of Spain, its altitude such that ice decorates the higher slopes from mid-autumn, despite temperatures continuing to soar on the coast below. It's possible to hike Mount Teide but the cable car is a far more comfortable means by which to appreciate the kaleidoscopic beauty of Teide National Park. All black lava fields, ochre sand dunes and fire-red mountains, the UNESCO World Heritage Site embodies everything you expect from a lunar landscape.

HOLD ON

Hold onto your bikini bottoms because things get pretty wild at Siam Park. The Canary Islands are home to several water parks and none garner rave reviews quite like this one, located in Costa Adeje. One of the biggest waterparks in Europe and considered by many to be one of the best in the world, this vast expanse of adrenaline-fuelled activity keeps visitors entertained with rushing river rapids and fear-inducing waterslides, with names like The Tower of Power and The Volcano enough to get your heart racing long before you've even scaled their steps. Scaredy-cats stay with us because relaxed attractions such as a serene floating market and a huge artificial beach are on offer for those who aren't quite so enamoured by promises of all things death-defying.












ROCK OUT

If it isn't your first time in Tenerife, give Mount Teide a miss and live it up like rock royalty at the brand new Hard Rock Hotel Tenerife, near Costa Adeje. A €40 day pass (€20 for children) will buy you access to all the hotel amenities, including the Rock Spa, three pools, a sparkling saltwater lagoon and the Hard Rock Roxity Kids Club. Day guests of the five-star resort will receive the cost of their pass as credit in any of its ten bars and restaurants, too. Sample Asian fusion at Narumi, great steak at Montauk or healthy fare with an ocean view at The Beach Club. With creative cocktails and panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean, rooftop sky lounge 'The 16th' is one of the hottest spots on the island.

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GRAN Canaria

Families in search of sun, sea and sand will find that and more in Las Palmas, Gran Canaria's lively capital. Home to the best beaches in the Canaries, plus the colourful Vegueta old quarter and the ever-popular Aqualand water park, Gran Canaria not only has all the markings of a family favourite, it offers some of the Canaries' most unusual excursions, too.





With an average 320 days of sun and more than 80 beaches on offer, Gran Canaria is a sunseeker's paradise. From hidden slithers of black volcanic sand to vast golden strips, the island has something to suit everyone and room for sandcastles galore. Maspalomas is Gran Canaria's biggest beach and undoubtedly its most popular. Along with the adjacent Playa del Inglés, it is a great choice for families, with calm water and endless dunes. A little further along the coast, Puerto Rico beach offers great water sports, whilst those who prefer a local feel will appreciate Las Canteras, an underrated stretch of sand in Las Palmas. The entire beach is a marine reserve, so bring your snorkel.

TEE OFF

Year-round sunshine and world-class courses designed by some of the biggest names in the business makes the Canary Islands a popular choice for golfers. The golf courses in Gran Canaria are among the best in Spain and with eight on offer you're never far away from the fairway. Some overlook sleek marinas, others palmfilled valleys and vast calderas, but all are an oasis of tranquillity and a break from the beaches.







RIDE ON

Gran Canaria has some of the best biking roads in the world, its mountainous terrain wound with smooth curves and hairpin bends. If the thought of leaving your beloved bike at home is almost too much to bear, get your fix on a motorcycle tour of the island. The one-day tours will show you Gran Canaria's highlights on a more memorable alternative to your usual island bus tours. Various routes are offered, all of them incorporating time to appreciate the spectacular coastline and enjoy the island. The rugged landscape does mean that some of the routes can be challenging, so you'll need to be a competent, experienced rider to join the rides. Bikes are provided, along with protective clothing, helmets, fuel and insurance.

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LANZAROTE

Lanzarote's landscape is surreal, as one may well expect from an island made up of around 100 volcanoes. Black, white and red beaches clash with the bright blue Atlantic Ocean and the Fire Mountains loom large above the unmissable Timanfaya National Park. Head north to the old capital of Teguise or stock up on potent pure aloe vera at farms across the island.

DIVE IN

Just off the south coast of Lanzarote, on an ocean bed 12 metres below the surface, stand 300 cement sculptures of human figures. Crowds 35-deep walk towards a hole in the wall, the only route into the deepest blue beyond, and businessmen in suits take a break on playground swings and see-saws. A little further along, a group of 13 refugees patiently await rescue in a sunken boat.

Jason deCaires Taylor's Museo Atlántico opened in January 2017 and has since become one of the most popular dive sites in the Canaries. Designed to create conversation around the importance of preserving our oceans and acting as a huge artificial reef to enable the island species to reproduce, the underwater sculpture museum is the first of its kind in Europe and is already frequented by rare angel sharks, barracudas and octopuses.







DRINK UP

When volcanic eruptions left the Canary Island soil useless for cultivating food crops, locals turned to more intoxicating alternatives. Today, there are more than 250 vineyards between the seven islands and more than 15 of those are found on Lanzarote. The area around La Geria sits in the lap of volcanic peaks, the black lava fields patterned with green vines cupped by crescents of stone. It's an arresting sight and the resulting produce is even more interesting; reds, rosés and whites, including the signature island tipple, Malvasía, will enamour oenophiles. La Geria Winery is one of the oldest and most visited vineyards in Spain. Enjoy a guided tour of the winery and estate, before tucking into tapas and a glass of the good stuff.

AND THE BEST OF THE REST...

While they may be small, La Gomera and La Palma (not to be confused with the Gran Canarian capital, Las Palmas) offer much to cruisers, especially by way of natural beauty.



WALK ON

Unlike much of the Canaries, La Gomera is awash with green. Fern rainforests and fertile gorges make for a hiker's heaven, with well-marked trails crisscrossing the island and offering a walk to suit all abilities. Follow in the footsteps of Christopher Columbus in San Sebastian, where the intrepid explorer stopped en route to the Americas, or walk in the shadow of giant palms on botanical banana plantations; the fruit is the island's biggest export. The green-fingered will also appreciate the pink bicácaros and almond blossoms that bloom in abundance around the island's picture-perfect mountain villages.

WATCH OUT

Like La Gomera, La Palma is a walker's paradise. However, when the weather is hot and your legs are tired, the opportunity to cruise the cool Atlantic in search of whales and dolphins is a welcome one. Tours along the north-west of the island see pods of dolphins appear alongside your catamaran as you ride the waves, dipping in and out of the caves carved into the coastline. You'll also have the chance to swim in the region's crystal-clear waters or brave the banana boat during your time on the tour.

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

Atlantic Isles attraction.

Around 70 miles west of Morocco, the Canary Islands and their neighbour Madeira – some 250 miles further north – have long drawn winter sun seekers thanks to a plentiful supply of warm weather during our coldest months. Indeed we are among the regular visitors to these beautiful Atlantic Isles. And the reason they remain such favourites is because they offer so much more than simply topping up your tan.

Gran Canaria.

This almost perfectly circular isle is known for its sandy south, where inviting beaches roll back into the great dunes of Maspalomas. Inland you'll find even more to captivate you. Its capital, Las Palmas, was the stopping-off point for all four of Columbus' Atlantic crossings. The building that claims to be his former house is now a museum in his honour, set in the historic Vergueta district. If this inspires you onto the Atlantic waves, stand-up paddle boarding is a relatively new addition to the capital's beach. To the north of the island, seventeenth-century Arucas recalls the style of towns that the conquistadores exported to South America albeit with a large Gothic cathedral. Don't forget the stunning Banderas Crater either.

Tenerife.

When it comes to symbols, few in the Canaries are as famous or as literally unmissable as Mount Teide. Ascending by cable car, you can survey the island from 11,660 feet, just a few hundred feet short of its summit. While the surrounding foothills of Teide National Park also encourage you to look down over the island's beauty, the area is also perfect for gazing upwards too. You could spend an evening in the company of an expert astronomer admiring the clear star-filled sky.

Lanzarote.

This is probably the closest you'll ever come to riding a camel on the moon! An otherworldly experience takes you by dromedary through the incredible lava fields of Timanfaya National Park towards Fire Mountain, with its dramatic red and black scenery. While the volcano has left its stunning imprint on the island, painter, architect and sculptor, César Manrique has contributed too. You might visit his extraordinary cactus garden, with 11,000 varieties, or even his quirky house, halfsubmerged in lava bubbles.







La Palma.

This is an island of volcanic beauty, vineyards and a charmingly compact capital of welcoming plazas, a seventeenth-century church – Iglesia del Salvador – and even a replica of Columbus' Santa Maria. One way to explore is by the quaint trolley train that rumbles along the main avenue. Further west stands El Paso, where you can glimpse into the 500-year-old tradition of silk weaving. Shoe designer Manolo Blahnik, who was born and raised on the island, has used the local silk for some of his exquisite creations.

Madeira.

There are certain quintessential experiences on this lush Portuguese-speaking island. Exploring the Botanical Gardens and the Farmer's Market for example, or shopping for local wine or wicker goods rate highly on most to-do lists. Monte is another. Having ascended to the town by cable car, with some breathtaking views on the way, your return is more fast-paced, as





you descend the steep streets by wicker sled. For a more serene day out, sip afternoon tea at the luxurious Reid's Palace hotel, set on the cliff-tops overlooking the Bay of Funchal and surrounded by lush tropical gardens.

Iberian gems along the way.

Seeking out the Atlantic Isles on our ships offers an ideal excuse to make a few other calls en route and during your return. For instance, many itineraries include **Lisbon**, with its captivating red rooftops and yellow trams. For something new, you could always retreat to the hillside resort of Sintra, with its grand Pene National Palace.

In northern Spain, **La Coruña** reveals its many graceful buildings, including those whose glass balconies gave rise to its nickname of the 'Crystal City'. Other intriguing visits include Europe's oldest working lighthouse, the wonderfully named Tower of Hercules, and Pazo de Oca Gardens, a former 15th century manor house sometimes dubbed the 'Galician Versailles'. Nearby **Vigo** is, for many, an invitation to seek out the medieval majesty of Santiago de Compostela. Yet the fishing village of Bayona is well worth considering too, and of course Vigo itself – a Segway tour offers an unusual way of getting around!

At the Peninsula's southern reaches stands **Málaga**. Birthplace of Picasso, the town is also a gateway to Ronda, nestled beautifully in the mountains, and even Granada, crowned by its Alhambra Palace – the 'Jewel of Moorish Spain.' The Moorish influence is evident in **Cádiz** too, where you're within easy reach of Seville, and its prestigious Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art, as well as Jerez in the heart of sherry country. Another much-loved call is **Gibraltar**, with its unique take on British life. Natural attractions here include St Michael's Cave, prickled with stalactites and stalagmites and, of course, the formidable Rock.

BACKPACK Optional

To say South America is diverse just doesn't quite cut it.

HE CONTINENT'S 12 countries contrast wildly and many of them are now placed at the feet of cruisers who never fancied the thought of lugging around a backpack. A holiday here holds the promise of Brazilian beaches, Chilean fjords, Argentinian cities, colonial Colombian towns and the endless, undulating Amazon Rainforest. Urban sprawls are replaced with remote expanses in the blink of an eye, bucket lists are obliterated and catching a case of joie de vivre is guaranteed. Grab a glass of Malbec and read on to find out why South America should be on your radar. BUCKET RIST IS a term thrown about with wild abandon but South America deserves its crown as one of the true bucket list destinations. No other holiday offers the opportunity to tick off quite so many of the 'things to do before you die' as one to this incredible continent.

If you have always wanted to stand at the feet of Christ the Redeemer, the beaches of Copacabana and Ipanema stretched out 2,330ft below, you can do so atop Rio's Corcovado Mountain. Later, you might dance the samba until midnight or perhaps you'll save your dancing feet to tango in Buenos Aires.

Machu Picchu is the jewel in the crown of gap year travels to South America and there are few travel experiences more rousing than watching the sun rise over the ancient 'Lost City of the Incas'. A pre or post-cruise land tour will take you closer to this and other Peruvian highlights, no backpack necessary.

For those to whom money is no object, a short two-and-a-half-hour flight can tick

Antarctica off your bucket list. The return flight will deliver you back to the luxury of your ship after a day of wildlife sightings and awesome scenery. If such adventures are beyond the realms of your budget, opt for an itinerary that incorporates a visit to the Falkland Islands instead, where you'll have equal – if not more – opportunity to spend time with comedic penguin colonies.

The Amazon Rainforest ranks high on bucket lists for many reasons. There are the lazy sloths that idle beneath the rainforest canopy and the rainbow macaws that fly above it. There's natural phenomenon in the 'Meeting of the Waters' in Manaus and there are snippets of the lives lived by mysterious indigenous communities on the banks of the Amazon's narrow tributaries.

For those who have already ticked Niagara Falls off the list, Iguazu Falls should be next. They are wider than Niagara Falls, their crescent of thunderous cascades roaring over the borders of both Argentina and Brazil. They're 30% taller than Niagara Falls too and are surrounded by the subtropical rainforest paradise of Iguazu National Park. Despite its moniker, time spent in Ushuaia – earth's southernmost city - feels like the start of a great adventure, rather than the 'end of the world'. The port's position at the very tip of the Argentine-Chilean border, where the Andes meet the Beagle Channel, make it a magnet for those whose bucket lists favour outdoor pursuits and meetings with Mother Nature. From glaciers to forests, waterfalls, lakes and mountain peaks, the city's world-famous Tierra del Fuego National Park is a beautiful adventure, as is time spent on the millpond waters of the Beagle Channel.

A cruise to South America also ticks off some of cruising's great bucket list voyages. Rounding Cape Horn and passing through Drake's Passage sees cruisers follow in the footsteps of historic trade vessels, ancient discovery ships and modern-day ocean yachts attempting to sail around the world in record speed. Cape Horn has been a major milestone in circumnavigation for centuries. Equally iconic is completing a passage of the Panama Canal, particularly for those who appreciate the marvels of modern engineering Stretching 50 miles to connect North and outh America, the canal – known as the rossroads of the World' – takes almost 14 s to transit in its entirety, although much norter partial transit itineraries are offered by ost cruise lines too.

MOTHER NATURE'S **ZOO**

ONE OF SOUTH America's biggest draws is its wildlife. The continent is the most ecologically diverse region in the world, its vast and varied landscapes having cultivated a thriving ecosystem that is home to more plant and animal species than anywhere else on earth.

The Amazon blankets around 1% of the earth's surface and 40% of that is spread across South America. As you might expect from a rainforest straddling nine countries, the Amazon is home to millions of species, many of them still undescribed. In fact, a new animal or plant species is found every three days here, according to the WWF.

This is Mother Nature's zoo, where the shrieks of howler monkeys echo around the jungle canopy and toucans with orange bills as big as their bodies aren't easily missed in the tropical greenery. Popular excursions here see you spot mythicallooking pink dolphins in Manaus, fish for piranhas in the espresso waters of Santarém and track endangered wildlife such as the elusive jaguar deep into the thick jungle.



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As you might expect from a rainforest straddling nine countries, the Amazon is home to millions of species. While the Amazon Rainforest is an obvious highlight for wildlife lovers, the flora and fauna spills out of the forest fringes and extends across the entire continent of South America.

There are the pom-pom festooned llamas kept as pets in Peru and the comical alpacas that watch from the sidelines as you tick Machu Picchu off your bucket list. The marine wildlife is almost as impressive as the glacial scenery in the Chilean Fjords, where you will stand meters away from penguin colonies and glimpse blue, grey and humpback whales in the icy waters. Look up and you'll see one of the largest birds in the world, the Andean condor, soaring above the Garibaldi glacier.











When you think penguins, you tend to think of the frozen expanses of Antarctica, yet the shrubby Falkland Islands and its windswept beaches are home to more than a million of them. Five of the seventeen penguin species are found here: King, Rockhopper, Magellanic, Macaroni and the largest population of Gentoo penguins in the world. All visiting cruise lines offer excursions to penguin rookeries, the most popular of which are the Gypsy Cove and Bluff Cove reserves. Penguins share the beaches and rocky outcrops with sea lions and elephant seals, while the waters around the Falkland Islands are known for their marine mammals. Orcas are commonly sighted in coastal waters during the summer and are resident all year round off the coast of Sea Lion Island.

THE CITIES OF the 14 countries and territories that make up this soul-stirring continent have enraptured intrepid travellers for years. Some charm you with their Spanish and Portuguese exuberance and colonial architecture, others leave you open-mouthed with imposing Andes backdrops or stretches of hot sand. It is impossible to see all of South America's great cities in a single holiday, the region is just too vast, but cruise along its coast and you'll dip in and out of some of its absolute highlights.

Passion. Joie de vivre. Lust for life. Whatever you choose to call it, Argentinians have it in spades. The steaks are thick, the Malbec is good and the tango lasts long into the night. Buenos Aires invented the dance once described as 'making love in the vertical position' and the destination is as sultry as its signature dance moves may suggest. There is an air of Parisian sensuality to the city, only the coffee is stronger and the weather is warmer. Highlights include the marble mausoleum of Cementerio de la Recoleta and the Plaza de Mavo, Argentina's most famous square and a stage on which the city's history has played out over the years.

Rio de Janeiro is a highlight for many cruisers to South America. The Brazilian capital is famous for its beaches and beauties, but the 'Cidade Maravilhosa' or 'Marvellous City' offers so much to see and do, it almost seems a shame to retire to the sands of Copacabana or Ipanema, despite their iconic status. Christ the Redeemer is one of the great modern wonders of the world, the city stretched out before him from the peak of Corcovado Mountain. It's an arresting sight, as is the sunset from Sugarloaf Mountain, a sight that overnight stays in the city will allow you to experience. Many cruise lines time itineraries to coincide with the Rio Carnival, the biggest party on the globe, but worry not if yours isn't one of them because impromptu samba parties are an everyday occurrence here.

Quito's Old Town is the largest in the Americas and is so impressive, it saw the Ecuadorian capital become the first ever UNESCO World Heritage City. Its grand churches, monasteries and atmospheric plazas nestle into the Andes, 17th-century facades making way for modern museums and boulevards as the altitude rises and the air cools.

The South American cities are a riot of colour and none more so than Cartagena, Colombia's characterful capital. Cartagena's position on the shores of the Caribbean makes for beautiful beaches and the best mojito this side of Cuba. In the city's colonial Old Town, horses and carriages clatter the streets, offering tired legs a rest after hours spent exploring the 400-year-old city walls of Las Murallas and the imposing Castillo San Felipe De Barajas. Of course, you could just refuel with fresh, zesty ceviche and a bottle of cold Cerveza Aguila beer instead.

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Other highlights include eclectic Montevideo and the remote Falkland Islands, plus a visit to Ushuaia, a destination known as 'The End of the World'. Few places offer quite the same feast for the senses as South America.

MSC Cruises' glamorous new ship is 'a wonder' for families on the hunt for fun in the Mediterranean sun.

S WE ARRIVE into Le Havre and enter the glittering atrium of MSC Meraviglia, one thing becomes clear; whatever 'it' is, this ship has it.

MSC Meraviglia has all the makings of a masterpiece. In fact, it is the one against which the ten due to be built by MSC Cruises over the next decade will be measured. Some might say that the new flagship is a game-changer for the cruise line. Having been on board for its christening ceremony, we can't help but agree.

The ship is gleaming, most of its surfaces either dark wood or polished chrome. The Atmosphere Pool is one of the most sizeable at sea, its silver-wrapped statues standing proud above the pool, cream cushioned loungers lending a sleek South Beach vibe to your sea days. The Bamboo Pool and its adjoining bar



hideaway at the very front of the ship. There are numerous Jacuzzis around MSC Meraviglia's four pool areas, but it is the one here, ever-so-slightly cantilevered over the side of the ship and with great sea views, that offers the best bubbling seat in the house.

The L'Olive Dorée and L'Olivo D'oro restaurants are traditional in decor, their menus anything but, and the Marketplace Buffet in which we enjoy our lunch is bright and airy, with open kitchens, accessible counters and even a mozzarellamaking area wielding tasty results. The MSC Yacht Club, MSC Cruises' unique 'ship-within-a-ship' concept, is all deep mahogany furniture and smoked mirrors




inside, with an external pool area that wouldn't look out of place on an oligarch's private yacht.

So far, so good and it was only a matter of time until we stumbled across a flash of flamboyance to ramp things up a notch. Those signature Swarovski staircases for example. On other ships, they were hidden away inside the exclusive MSC Yacht Club, but on MSC Meraviglia they are scattered around the ship for all to enjoy.

MSC Meraviglia is a ship for all seasons, designed to offer as much on board as MSC Cruises do ashore (there are around 40 excursions available on each itinerary). The 96 metre long Mediterranean-style promenade brings the outdoor in, the 'sky' illuminated by an 80 metre LED screen. When we walk through on our way for drinks at the Brass Anchor Pub after dinner, the ceiling is lit with a stained-glass display that could rival any cathedral in Italy. The LED sky plays a starring role in the mini-shows and pre-dinner parades held here each night, a taste of the evening's entertainment to come. It is a sight that creates instant atmosphere and leaves adults and children equally awestruck.

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Come evening, the Carousel Lounge becomes another glitzy jewel in MSC Meraviglia's crown. This custom-designed entertainment and dining venue was the first ever at sea to be co-designed with Cirque du Soleil, creating the perfect place in which to host their exclusive shows SONOR and VIAGGIO, the first of eight original Cirque du Soleil at Sea shows created especially for the Meraviglia generation of ships.

In the Amusement Park, we revert to being kids again, impatiently awaiting our turn on the attractions. The Interactive XD cinema is cool, the Flight Simulator cooler still, but it is the two full-size Formula1 virtual-reality racing cars that gets everyone really excited. There's a full-length bowling alley too, with two lanes encouraging some healthy competition between friends and family. With an adjoining Sports Bar dishing up food and drinks to fuel the fun, plus a plentiful supply of big screen TVs, this is where you'll find any stray teens or sport-mad men.

MSC Meraviglia is the ship of the summer for families. The amusement park and children's areas – some of the best at sea, thanks to partnerships with Chicco and LEGO – are all together on one deck for the first time ever. The ship boasts the most extensive offering for families in the fleet, with highlights including an actionpacked Aqua Park and Himalayan Bridge ropes course, a covered all-weather pool, plus 'Cabins for Families'. These modular cabins can accommodate 10 people in comfort and are a first for the fleet, with fares charged per cabin rather than per person.

There are more dining choices for families too, with the introduction of flexible









dining, a new family buffet area with lower counters so the kids can help themselves, and Jean-Philippe Maury's 'chocolate factory', where guests can design their own chocolate bar on an iPad and watch it being made.

Another brand-new development debuted aboard MSC Meraviglia is 'MSC for Me', a mobile app and bracelet device combination that allows guests to do everything from entering their staterooms to booking shows, dining and excursions. Parents will also be able to use the technology to track the location of their children in real-time, something bound to come in handy on a ship that is the fourth largest ever to sail.

MSC Meraviglia can dock at any cruise port around the world, meaning that nowhere is out of bounds for family travellers. For the time being, the ship will sail seven-night itineraries in the Western Mediterranean, calling at Naples, Messina, Valletta, Barcelona, Marseille and Genoa. It's a part of the world as wonderful as the ship that will call it home. If you have long toyed with the idea of cruising as a family, a week aboard MSC Meraviglia in the Mediterranean is the perfect introduction to time spent at sea.



36 HOURS IN VENICE

Venice is one of those places that must be seen to be believed. Films and photographs do no justice to the beauty of 'La Serenissima', the floating city set upon a lagoon in the Adriatic Sea. Only when you spend time there yourself can you throw back the curtains on Italy's most dramatic city.

DON'T MISS...

OU CAN'T VISIT Venice without seeing its icons but it pays to be clever about the order in which you go about it. St Mark's Basilica doesn't open for visitors until 9.45am but anyone is welcome to attend its atmospheric Holy Mass. Mass celebrations are held hourly until 11.00am, however it is the early 7.00am and 8.00am gatherings which will see you beat the crowds. By the time 9.45am rolls around and St. Mark's opens its doors to general visitors, you will already have moved on to nearby Doge's Palace and the Torre dell'Orologio, putting you one step ahead of the crowds.

Head further east from the Doge's Palace region and you will find yourself in the largely residential district of Castello. Gondolas are replaced with small private boats here and washing flaps in the wind above the canals, hung out by the same locals you see dipping into bars and bookshops as they go about their daily lives, something rarely seen in central Venice. Despite retaining such an authentic local feel, Castello is home to some of Venice's most important attractions, including the Scuola di San Giorgio degli Schiavoni and its collection of Vittore Carpaccio paintings. The diverse district also incorporates the Arsenale, Venice's ancient naval shipyard, and the Napoleonic Gardens, the largest park in the city and home of the famous Biennale d'Arte de Venezia. A walk along the great Riva degli Schiavoni promenade will have you back in Piazza San Marco in 10 minutes.



Located in Piazza San Marco, the Campanile di San Marco is the tallest building in the city and offers fantastic views across the lagoon, the Lido and even the Dolomites in the distance. Alternatively, San Giorgio Maggiore offers an equally impressive view with fewer crowds. Condé Nast described the comparison as the equivalent of going to the Top of the Rock instead of the Empire State; no better, no worse, just different and far quieter.



We can't mention the Venetian icons without talk turning to gondolas, the city's signature mode of transport and a huge aspect of its individuality. Yes, a gondola tour of the city is expensive at €80 for 40 minutes, however the experience is one which will stay with you forever. If you would prefer a cheaper alternative that isn't too dissimilar, try the traghetto. Effectively a large gondola rowed by two oarsmen, the traghetto is used to ferry people across the Grand Canal and is a much less expensive alternative at just €2. Less romantic but even more inexpensive is the vaparetto, a practical and affordable water bus service operating on the main canals and surrounding islands.

If this isn't your first time in Venice, it may well be worth considering excursions and tours that delve a little deeper into the city and its culture. Cooking classes with Venetian contessa. Enrica Rossa are considered some of the best in the world. An aristocrat born and bred on the lagoon, Enrica meets her students at the foot of the Rialto Bridge and heads for the nearby Rialto Market to select ingredients with the group. Next, it is back to her family's grand 17th-century palazzo in the Dorsoduro district, but not before calling into her favourite bàcari for prosecco and cicchetti en route. Enrica's approach to Venetian cuisine is simple but delicious, the ingredients thrown together with her distinctive Italian flair to create plates of antipasti, pasta, meat and fish courses that just keep on coming. It's a great way to see a more authentic side of Venice and to indulge in some fantastic local food.

Kayaking the Grand Canal probably isn't the first activity that comes to mind when

planning ways to spend a day in Venice, but it promises a completely new perspective on the city. Half day kayak tours will not only take you closer to the city's must-see sights, it will also traverse the quieter canals, giving you access to areas of Venice that you would never see on a traditional gondola tour.



With 36 hours to spend in Venice, you can afford to venture a little further away from the historic centre. There are more than a hundred islands in the Venetian ecosystem, so it's safe to say that there is much to see beyond St. Mark's Square and the Bridge of Sighs. Each of the islands offers something entirely different to its visitors, from the colourful canalside and lace makers of Burano to the stained-glass artisans of Murano and the vineyards of Sant'Erasmo. Just a handful of residents live on the island of Torcello and tourists rarely venture beyond

the rose-covered outdoor terrace of its most famous address, the Locanda Cipriani restaurant. Those who do are rewarded with a semi-deserted island of green fields, unhurried canals and the Byzantine architecture of its Cathedral of Santa Maria Assunta. It is a little-known fact that Torcello was the first of the Venetian islands to be inhabited and its history alone makes it worth the 45-minute trip across the lagoon.

High summer in Venice can be very humid but the beachfronts of the Lido and Pellestrina offer a retreat from the heat of the city's inner reaches. The Lido is a skinny stretch of sand a ten-minute vaparetto ride from St. Mark's Square, looking out to the Adriatic Sea on one side and the Venetian lagoons on the other. In August, the destination receives a glitzy makeover when the red carpet is rolled out for the Venice Film Festival, which has been held at the Lido's Hotel Excelsior since 1932. Just across the way from the Lido, the fishing community of Pellestrina occupies a strip of land separating the lagoon from the Adriatic Sea. It is just a short ferry ride from Venice proper but its wild beaches and blue, swimmable waters feel a million miles away from the hustle and bustle.





TUCK IN...

TALY MAY BE world-famous for its pizza but a ban on wood-fired ovens means that Venice is not. There are only a handful of places offering pizza in Venice, with St Mark's Square based Rossopomodoro (Calle larga San Marco 404) considered one of the best. Venice values its heritage and such pride extends to the food on offer, too. A new law was recently introduced to limit the number of eateries able to sell pizza by the slice, as well as banning new kebab shops and fast food restaurants, a decision taken by local authorities "to preserve decorum and tradition" in the city. In our opinion, it would be a travesty to visit Venice and not indulge in its unique cuisine anyway, so head to these local hangouts for fresh seafood and pasta galore.

Alla Madonna (San Polo 594, Calle de la Madonna) may be near the Rialto Bridge, but it is frequented by more Venetian families than tourists. The atmosphere and decor is a throwback to a postwar Venice heyday and unlike many restaurants in Venice, the menu here offers both meat and seafood; ask the dapper waiter to fill you in on the dish of the day.

Eat in a garden of daisies, roses and dahlias at Locanda Cipriani (Piazza Santa

Fosca, 29), an old-style trattoria on the tiny rural island of Torcello. Founded by its namesake Giuseppe Cipriani and still family-owned, the restaurant is an oasis in picturesque surroundings. The spot is loved by locals, world royalty and the Hollywood A-list alike, with George Clooney describing dinner there as "a perfect afternoon!".

Locals on the island of Murano, the one with the glass, spend their lunch breaks at La Perla Ai Bisatei (Campo San Bernardo, 6), a neighbourhood trattoria with no airs and graces, just authentic Italian cuisine served with a smile. Discovery of the modest cashonly restaurant is a happy accident for most, plates piled with spaghetti alle vongole and fritto misto di mare leaving you feeling like you have uncarthed a real hidden gem.

Seafood is crucial to Venetian cuisine and you'll find some of the best at Riva Rosa (Via San Mauro, 296) on Burano, where the menu changes daily depending on the catch of the day. Burano is a beautiful island and Riva Rosa's soft pink exterior sits pretty on a bend in the canal. For special occasions, request the 'altana' table for two on the roof terrace; the views over Burano and the Venetian lagoon are wonderful.







(HarperCollins Publishers)







(Quercus Publishing)



CULINARY CORNER

ATUL KOCHHAR'S CHICKEN KORMA WITH RAISIN PILAU RICE

INGREDIENTS

4 boneless skinless chicken thighs, large dice

Korma sauce

1 onion, diced 2 tbsp vegetable oil 60g cashew nuts, roasted until light golden, then crushed 1 tsp green chilli 2 tsp ginger, pureed 5 green cardamom pods, crushed Pinch saffron 150g yoghurt 1 tbsp cream 30g butter Sea salt, to taste

Raisin pilau rice

125g basmati rice 1 tsp vegetable oil 2 tsp garlic, pureed 1 tbsp onion, diced 1 tsp ground coriander Large pinch chilli powder 1 tbsp chopped tomatoes 1 tbsp raisins 5g butter Sea salt, to taste

METHOD

For the korma

1. Heat the oil in a saucepan over a medium heat and then add the onion, cashew nuts, green chilli, ginger and cardamom. Cook for 3-5 minutes until the onion has softened slightly and the onion is only a light golden colour.

2. Remove from the heat and blend in a food processor until paste-like.

3. Return the blended mixture to the pan, add the saffron, yogurt, cream and butter and bring to the boil.

4. Add the chicken and simmer for 10-15 minutes until the chicken thigh pieces are cooked through and tender.

5. Remove from the heat and adjust the seasoning with salt.

For the raisin pilau rice

1. Cook the basmati rice and once cooked spread out in a thin layer to allow it to cool.

2. Heat the oil in a saucepan on a medium heat, add the garlic, cook for 30 seconds until a light golden brown colour.

3. Add the onion and cook for 3-4 minutes, until starting to soften.

4. Mix in the ground coriander, chilli powder, chopped tomatoes and raisins.

5. Add the rice and stir until well combined. Continue to cook, stirring occasionally until the mixture is piping hot. To finish the dish stir through the butter and season to taste with salt.

CULINARY CORNER

JAMES MARTIN'S ORANGE AND RAPESEED OIL CAKE

OLIVE OIL CAKE IS NOTHING NEW TO ANYONE WHO IS FAMILIAR WITH ITALIAN COOKING – IT'S A GOOD WAY TO KEEP THE CAKE LOVELY AND MOIST. RAPESEED OIL IS A GREAT ALTERNATIVE, THOUGH, AS IT HAS A SLIGHTLY MILDER FLAVOUR.

INGREDIENTS - SERVES 8–10

5 large oranges
100ml rapeseed oil
4 eggs
450g caster sugar
125g self-raising flour
125g ground almonds
2 teaspoons baking powder
150g cream cheese
150g crème fraîche
25g icing sugar
25g walnut halves, crumbled
1 tablespoon basil cress or tiny basil leaves

METHOD

• Preheat the oven to 170°C/325°F/gas mark 3. Lightly butter a 23cm springform cake tin.

³ Remove the zest from three of the oranges and set aside, then remove the pith and discard. Roughly chop the flesh, then either place in a saucepan with the rapeseed oil and blitz until puréed with a stick blender, or blitz with the oil in a food blender.

• Whisk the orange zest, eggs and 250g of the caster sugar in a food mixer or a large bowl with an electric whisk, until the mixture is very light and ribbons form when the whisk is lifted out.

• Mix the flour, ground almonds and baking powder together in a separate bowl. Fold half the puréed orange into the eggs, then add all the flour and the rest of the puréed orange.

• Pour into the cake tin and bake for one hour until golden-brown and risen. Check the cake is cooked by inserting a clean skewer or knife into the centre – if it comes out clean, the cake is ready; if not, cook for a further five minutes and check once more.

• While the cake cooks, prepare the topping. Whisk the cream cheese, crème fraîche and icing sugar together in a bowl until smooth and thickened, and chill in the fridge until needed.

• Peel the last two oranges using a vegetable peeler, then slice the peel very finely into julienne. Put 150ml of water into a saucepan with 150g of caster sugar and the julienned orange peel. Bring to the boil and simmer for 8–10 minutes. Strain into a sieve set over a bowl and press through lightly to remove the sugar syrup. You can use this for a salad dressing or in another cake.

⁽⁾ Place the last 50g of caster sugar on a plate and toss the julienned orange peel into it, moving it around with your hands to make sure all the strands are coated.

• Remove the cake from the oven and allow it to cool in the tin before turning it out and cooling completely on a wire rack. Spread the frosting over the top of the cooled cake and decorate with crumbled walnut pieces, the candied julienne strips and basil cress.

Without the cress the cake will keep in an airtight container in the fridge for up to one week.
