NORWEGIAN BLISS FEATURES REVEALED BY NCL

NORWEGIAN CRUISE LINE has revealed the features of Norwegian Bliss, including the largest competitive racetrack at sea.

The 4,000-passenger Norwegian Bliss will be the 16th ship in the NCL fleet, sailing to Alaska and the Caribbean from June 2018.

The ship's hotly-anticipated features were finally revealed at an exclusive event in Las Vegas, where Norwegian Cruise Line president and chief executive, Andy Stuart, said: "Norwegian Bliss will no doubt be our most incredible ship to date."

He continued: "We have elevated

Norwegian Bliss's onboard experience to new heights, bringing the best features from across our fleet plus exciting new first-at-sea activities like the largest racetrack and new dining concepts to create the ultimate cruising experience."

Features announced include an open-air laser tag course, a pool and sundeck featuring two spacious pools and six infinity hot tubs that scale the side of the ship, an Aqua Park with two multi-storey waterslides and a kids' Aqua Park and Splash Academy.

Also making its debut on Norwegian Bliss is 'the largest competitive racetrack at sea'. The 1000ft two-level racetrack will cater

for novice, intermediate and advanced drivers, its silent electric cars reaching speeds of up to 30 miles per hour.

In terms of new dining venues, the vessel will be the first to debut Q, a Texas smokehouse, and Los Lobos, serving Mexican cuisine. New a la carte dessert venue Coco's will dish up sweets and treats day and night.

During its summer season, Norwegian Bliss will sail weekly 7-day Alaska itineraries each Saturday from Seattle. The ship will spend its inaugural winter season from November 2018 sailing 7-day itineraries in the Eastern Caribbean from Port Miami.





SAGA LAUNCHES NEW FOUR-NIGHT TASTER CRUISE

SAGA HAVE LAUNCHED a new four-night mini-cruise to Amsterdam, aimed at providing a delicious introduction to holidaying with the over 50s cruise line.

Saga Sapphire will depart Southampton on the 'Flavours of Amsterdam' sailing on 9 November 2018. The taster cruise will offer guests the option to embark on an evening pub crawl around Amsterdam, sampling beer brewed in the city and tasting jenever, a Dutch spirit similar to gin. The leisurely excursion will visit the city's key attractions, including the old Stock Exchange, Dam Square and the Royal Palace, the Old Church and the Red Light District.

An overnight stay in Amsterdam will provide plenty of time to sample tasty tripels, fruity white beers and pilsners in some of the best bars in the city. Guests will also have the opportunity to get out and about in Amsterdam,

discovering the city's beautiful canals, museums and galleries.

The mini-cruise will also visit Bruges, where the cobbled streets are paved with places serving up a host of Belgian beers. Chocoholics are well catered for with some of the finest chocolate shops in the world too.

Fares for the Flavours of Amsterdam sailing start from £633pp, including UK travel to and from Southampton, all meals and entertainment, choice of table wines at lunch and dinner, afternoon tea, 24-hour room service, unlimited tea and coffee in selected venues, free Wi-Fi, all on-board gratuities, free shuttle bus to nearest town centre (whenever possible and when the ship is berthed more than 500 yards away), optional travel insurance and additional cancellation rights, or a discount if passenger has own insurance.

ROYAL CARIBBEAN START CONSTRUCTION ON SPECTRUM OF THE SEAS

Royal Caribbean International marked the start of construction for its new Quantum Ultra ship – Spectrum of the Seas – with the cutting of the first piece of steel at the Meyer Weft shipyard.



Spectrum of the Seas will debut in 2019 and will be specifically designed for guests in Asia. The ship will join sister ships Quantum of the Seas and Ovation of the Seas, which currently operate from Shanghai and Tianjin.

The next-generation Quantum Ultra ship will feature "cutting edge and unprecedented experiences and amenities" according to Michael Bayley, chief executive and president of Royal Caribbean International.

GOING DUTCH

Rijksmuseum goes around the world on Holland America Line's Westerdam

"LOOK OUT FOR THE SWAN!"



NOT WORDS YOU expect to hear on board a cruise ship, unless you're sailing along the Thames. We weren't. In fact, we were under the blue skies of Barcelona, where the Queen's fair-feathered friends are replaced with squawking lime green parakeets and flocks of gulls with a taste for tapas.

With a 12-day dry dock in Palermo complete and a budget of almost £50 million spent, Holland America Line's Westerdam had returned to European waters with a dramatic new look and we were in Barcelona to see

the results of the overhaul for ourselves.

Having lost sight of our official tour leader somewhere between picking out our spot in the refurbished Retreat and daydreaming about afternoons in the Greenhouse Spa, we found ourselves with a new guide. Tall, South African and with a fondness for the work of Dutch Golden Age painters, Westerdam's Culinary Operations Manager was the kind of chaperone who made you take notice.

While he may have been the object of our affections, the object of his was the brand

new and exclusive Rijksmuseum at Sea and right there, taking flight in what was once the guest services lobby, was The Threatened Swan. The original oil painting by Jan Asselijn is displayed in the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam, but it had been recreated on a huge scale in a serene space that is one of the highlights of Westerdam's extensive enhancements.

Holland America Line has sponsored Amsterdam's Rijksmuseum since 2015 and whilst restrictions such as climate control, security and insurance mean that original masterpieces from the museum rarely make their way outside of its walls, they are recreated in stunning definition on vast murals and a huge high-resolution LED screen on Westerdam, which now boasts the fleet's first Rijksmuseum at Sea. The arty spot is a nod to Holland America Line's Dutch heritage and is already proving popular with patrons.

Another of Westerdam's most notable enhancements and a biggie for anyone who has ever fancied themselves as the captain of the ship, is the debut of a virtual bridge displaying live navigational information mirroring that screened to the captain himself.

This virtual bridge is just part of a whole host of new technology in the brand-new Explorations Central, or EXC lounge, much of it revolving around a destination theme.

Destination is a huge focus for Holland America Line, with the fleet sailing to over 400 ports in 100 countries and holding a reputation as one of the best at sea for immersive itineraries that really dig deep into your ports of call. As other cruise lines create ships

designed to be destinations in themselves, Holland America Line stands firm in its belief that we travel to see the world, not only the ship.

Speaking about the importance of not only the journey but the destination, Holland America Line President, Orlando Ashford, said: "Travel has the power to change people in a positive and important way. In ways we don't even realise. As our perspective shifts, opinions and values shift too and we become fundamentally changed. Travel has the potential to change the world."

The contemporary EXC lounge is dedicated to destination experience, from state-of-the-art TV systems sharing information on the

ship's location to interactive touchscreens giving guests the lowdown on what to do in ports of call, minus the usual pressure to book the ship's excursions. Rumour has it that this is where you will find the best coffee on board too.

Westerdam's revamp also sees new bar and entertainment venues introduced, several of them demonstrating Holland America Line's love of music.

The theory behind the cruise line's signature 'Music Walk' is a belief that live music should always be found somewhere on board the ship, whatever time of day. The refurbishment has enhanced Westerdam's musical offering, bringing it in line with that

aboard the 2016-launched Koningsdam, with Billboard Onboard and Lincoln Center Stage now joining the existing BB King's Blues Club. As well as blues tunes to get your toes a-tapping, Holland America Line's signature blues bar now serves as the backdrop for the new look America's Test Kitchen too. Inspired by one of the longest running programmes on US TV, the cooking show is recreated on stage under the expert guidance of the ship's resident America's Test Kitchen chef, with guests sampling his experimental recipes as part of cooking demonstrations and hands-on workshops.

When the weather is hot, it is what is going on outdoors that ranks highest on

our agenda. Westerdam's refurbishment sees The Retreat relocated from deck 10 to deck 11, with 15 private cabanas welcoming guests who book the private space for the length of their cruise or just a single day. Unlike similar areas on other ships, The Retreat is family-friendly, with family cabanas available at the same cost as regular twin cabanas but be warned; there are just a handful of them available and they are extremely popular, so get in there quick. Following its relocation, The Retreat is now just a single flight of stairs away from the main pool, where a climate controlled roof means you can have Antiguan heat even in Stavanger.

When it comes to accommodation, a further 25 staterooms have been added to deck 10, increasing Westerdam's passenger capacity to 1,964. Existing suites have been upgraded with polished stone bathroom surfaces, new soft furnishings and carpets, plus those all-important bedside USB charging ports.

Ship tours are thirsty work but even the salt-rimmed gin cocktails couldn't detract from the sleek sophistication of Westerdam's new Gallery Bar. Replacing the underused Northern Lights nightclub, this sultry space was one of our favourite spots on the whole ship, deep armchairs, mirrored ceilings and quirky artworks in gilded frames creating quite the atmosphere for evening drinks.

Westerdam's overhaul marks the beginning of a three-year, £230million programme of upgrades for Holland America Line's fleet, designed to bring the operator's 14 mid-sized ships in line the newest arrival, Koningsdam. Next in line for a makeover is Nieuw Statendam, pencilled in for a 2018 appointment at Palermo. In the meantime, Westerdam is better than ever and waiting for you.

After her 2017 Mediterranean season, Westerdam will offer 7-night Caribbean itineraries through the winter, then be deployed in Alaska for summer 2018. For Winter 2018/9 the ship will sail to Asia, offering a wide choice of itineraries from Singapore, Hong Kong, Shanghai and Japan.

THE CALL OF THE WILD

Crisp. Silent. Still. With an energy indescribable and a beauty inexpressible. And were that not enough, it's the happiest place on earth too.



THE NORWEGIAN FJORDS are the pride of Norway. The nation's heart and soul in granite form, bathed with an ice white light in the morning and aflame with a peach glow as the sun sets. When it sets. After all, this is the land of the midnight sun and the northern lights, the ever-changing hues only adding to the atmosphere.

Lapped by inky waters and held up on a pedestal almost as tall as the searing cliff faces themselves, the Norwegian Fjords are utterly beautiful. They shouldn't be on your bucket list. Why wait? Go now.

Don't be reluctant to trade sun, sea and sand for mountains, glaciers and waterfalls. This is scenery that stirs your soul and ignites your sense of adventure. Toy with vertigo at Pulpit Rock and train your eyes on the dark waters around Tromsø, waiting with bated breath for the steely grey skin of a humpback whale to break the surface. Follow the coastline further north into the Arctic Circle and you'll find yourself in polar bear territory. Look up and you might just find yourself beneath the metre-wide wings of a white-tailed eagle.

Catch the spray of the Seven Sisters Waterfall in your hair and watch the goose bumps form as the chill of the Jostedalsgreen ice cap hits your skin. The largest glacier in mainland Europe won't be here forever; its icy blue mass is not-so-slowly shrinking, so see it while you still can. If you're there at just the right time, you might even hear the guttural roar of its ice calving.

Those fortunate enough to call the vast valleys nestled amidst the fjords home have created villages, towns and cities as intriguing as the region's natural wonders. Bergen is the starting point for many fjords cruises, busier than you expect, with Bryggen's timber reminders of the gentlemanly Hanseatic League sandwiched between high-end shops and a raucous fish market. The fjord village of Olden takes its role as the gateway to the beautiful Nordfjord seriously, encouraging its visitors to get out and about on the glacier-fed waters of Oldevatnet Lake or hosting them

in Jostedalsgreen National Park. Heading further north, as far as you can go whilst staying on European soil, reindeer graze all year round in the North Cape, herded by the indigenous Sami people.

Where you go and what you see depends on who you cruise with. Scenery and sophistication come together for the luxury lover and full-blown expeditions into the Arctic wilderness spark a flame with explorers. Back to nature bank holidays are a blessing for the time-strapped and burned out, and the fjords for families sees kids go wild in the great outdoors. Decide which category you fall under and read on for our recommendations.

FOR THE TIME-STRAPPED

MUCH HAS BEEN made of the digital detox, a time to disconnect from the Wi-Fi, put down your mobile and close the laptop. The truth of the matter is that the Norwegians have known the importance of switching off for years. There is an inherent appreciation of the great outdoors here, with time spent reconnecting with nature considered a basic human need. Norway is such a vast country that less than 25% of Norwegians live in rural areas, but the close proximity of the cities to the surrounding fjords and woodlands makes getting out and lapping up all that fresh air a breeze. In this part of the world, an after-work stroll out of the city can see you in the wilderness in less than an hour.

Planned to coincide with the 2018 bank holidays, Fred Olsen's 'Five Night Fjords'

itineraries are heaven sent if you're on the brink of burnout but don't have the same access to the wilds. Departing late on Thursdays, sailing from the northern UK ports of Newcastle or Edinburgh means that within a day of leaving the UK, a leisurely day of eating, drinking and being merry no less, you'll find yourself in Fjordland.

Despite the shorter than usual itinerary, you'll spend plenty of time in port. The five-night foray into the fjords sees you negotiate the sweeping curves of the Lysefjord, spend a full day in Bergen and visit Eidfjord. Here you'll have the opportunity to kayak along the dramatic Hardangerfjord – Norway's second longest fjord – and tour the towering Vøringfoss Waterfall. After sailing deep into the Hardangerfjord, eyes wide at a wild landscape that wouldn't look out of

place in Disney's Frozen, you'll divert into Maurangerfjord, where catching sight of the Furebergfossen Waterfall is the perfect end to an amazing bank holiday break. Come Tuesday morning, you'll wake back in British waters feeling rejuvenated and as if the whole weekend was little more than a dream.

It sure beats a weekend of DIY, doesn't it?

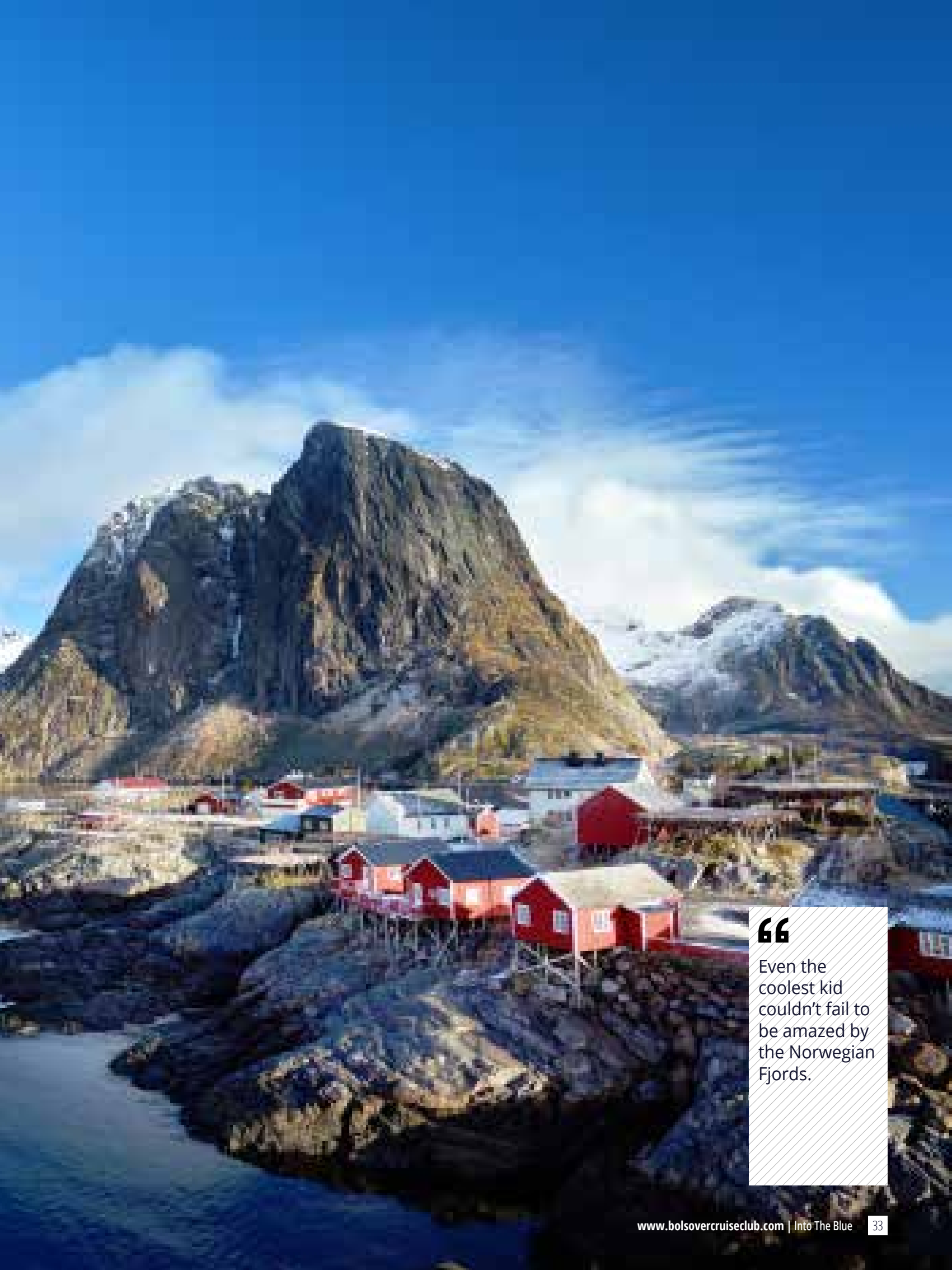

From the screen to the seas with new Princess Cruises ambassador, Phillip Schofield

How do you feel about your new role?

It's really exciting. Like anyone looking into holidays, I got googling straight away and looked at the ships and the quality, and I was keen to get started. Then I met the Princess team, who are all so lovely. We're like-minded about what we want to do, so it was a very easy match.

What appeals to you the most about the idea of cruise holidays?

You travelled on Royal Princess recently – did you get a good tour of the ship?

And I'm a bit of an engineering geek, so all the behind-the-scenes stuff is fascinating to me. On Royal Princess, I got to go into the galleys and have a really good wander. What an

awe-inspiring operation that is! I loved that. And obviously, the kid in me loved going up to the Captain's bridge. It was like being on the Starship Enterprise, so I was impressed with that as well.

You are known for your love of wine – did you sample the onboard wine list?

Yes, I had a very, very close inspection of it! The wine list onboard is ridiculous, it's so good. If you're into Italian wines, the list of top-end options is breathtaking, and I was surprised by the value for money. And at the lower end, the attention to detail with everyday wines is super.

We took a road trip around the UK recently and that was great, too. I drove about 2,200 miles in total. Steph drove 30 miles when we were in Islay – because I was full of whisky!

Are there many places left in the world that you would still like to see?

Hundreds! And as the years go by, you think, 'How am I ever going to do all this?' I've never been to Japan, I want to go to St Petersburg, I haven't seen the Fjords, or Canada, or Alaska. And I've only done a tiny part of South America... the world is massive, and my ticklist is huge!

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EASTER ISLAND EXPLORATION

Jo Clough spent three days on Easter Island and relates how this changed her understanding of its history.

BENO BRIDLED WHEN I referred to the scattered stonework at an unrestored platform as statues. “These are our ancestors” he said emphatically. I didn’t make the mistake again!

Easter Island had been on my bucket list for years but its remoteness, some 3,000 miles to the west of Chile, makes it difficult to get to. With a cruise starting in Buenos Aires booked, Easter Island, or Rapa Nui to Easter Islanders, was now in reach, just.

In fact, ‘Rapa Nui’ is the term used by the descendants of the thirteen tribes that settled there a millennium ago when referring to the island, themselves and their language. Although annexed by Chile in

1888, the Rapa Nui are trying to get their name for their homeland included on maps in addition to the currently accepted one.

Beno, and our other guide, Teatrohero, were both Rapa Nui but from different tribes. Both were heavily tattooed, a tradition among the men. “If you withstood the pain of the process, (they used bone needles) and then survived the inevitable infection, you were a man” explained Beno. His hair had not been cut since childhood and stretched down his back until he wound it up into a top knot that he pinned in place on the top of his head. Such stone top knots or ‘Pukao’ were present on several of the ancestors that had been restored on platforms.

So many questions kept the conversation flowing. Why the ancestors? As we now take photographs of our families, the Rapa Nui did the same – by carving stones into their likeness before they died. Beno related that those chosen were men who had exhibited power and wisdom (‘mana’) during their lifetime and were not necessarily chiefs. The belief was that having an ancestor watching over the village would enable the people to still benefit from his mana.

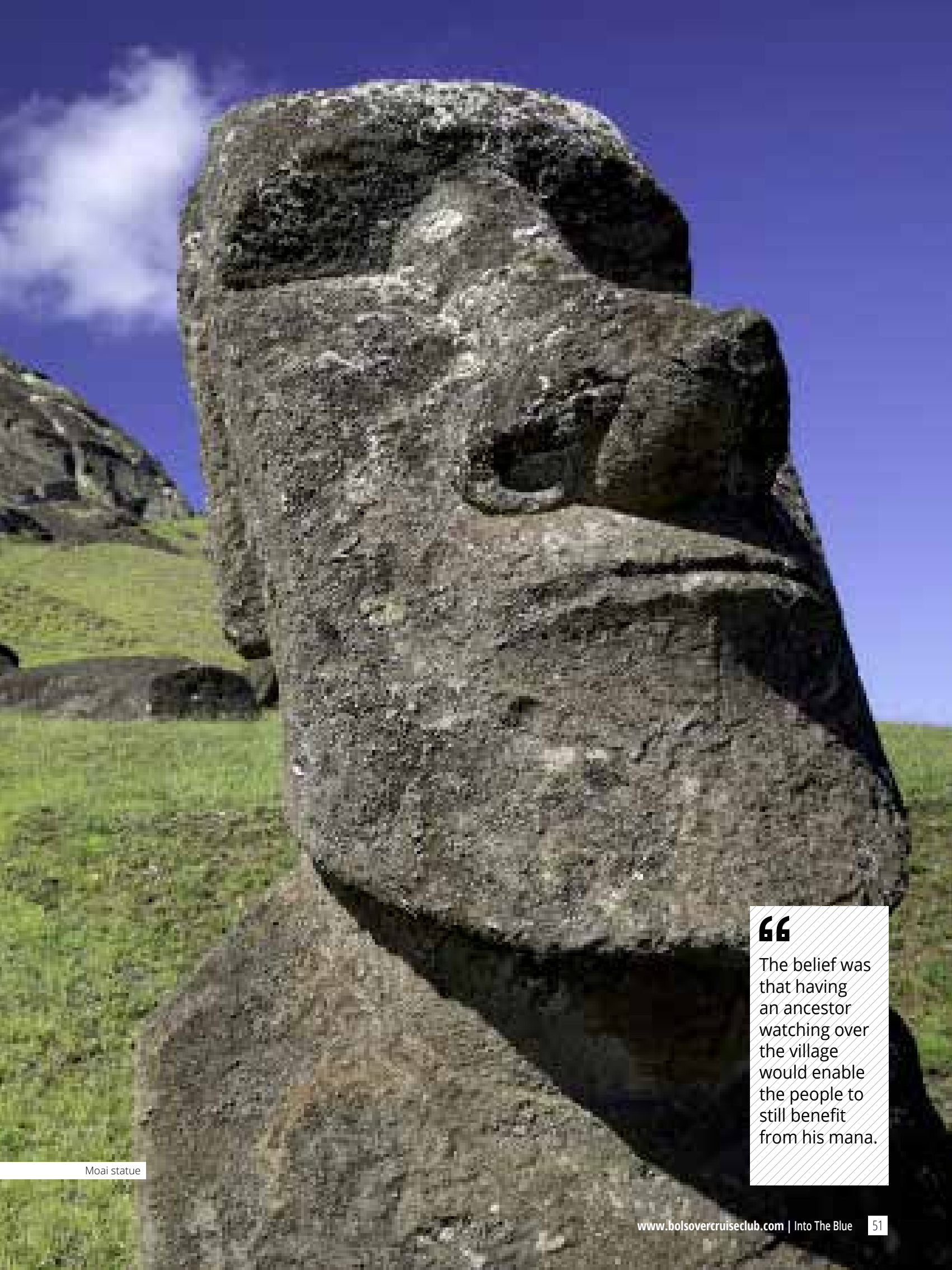
But why were some ancestors left in the quarry or by the roadside? Beno continued that these were not ancestors. The title of ancestor was only bestowed when a carving (‘Moai’) was positioned on a platform and had its eye sockets carved. Any Moai that fell by the wayside before this were deemed to have lost their power and of no use. Close inspection of those on the platforms and the rest showed clearly that only the former had carved eye sockets.

Even today, the Rapa Nui pass on their oral traditions to their children and these do not always concur when relating their history. For example, in the quarry the oral traditions of our two guides differed when I asked who did the carving. One version had it that members of the tribe did the work, whilst the other version recalled the tribe paying a master mason at the quarry.

The absence of trees on the island is the first impression gained as the plane circles for its approach to the runway. The latest theory by an American archaeologist claims that rats had eaten all the tree seeds. Beno snorts. “PhD students from American universities, with a thesis to write, come



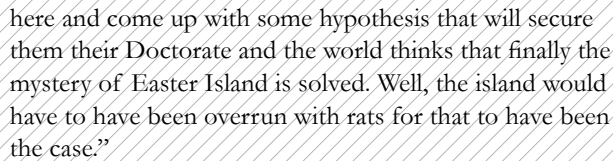

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AN ODE TO THE IMPISH ITALIAN

Naples may be the wild child of Campania but it is those who live with wild abandon that have the best stories to tell. Here's why the tale of Naples is one worth listening to.

SORRENTO IS STUNNINGLY beautiful, Rome is regal and Florence is a Renaissance masterpiece. But Naples is real. This is where Neapolitans live and breathe and love as they have done for centuries. There are no red velvet ropes standing between you and the artefacts, and no polished marble promenades with fledgling potted palms to prettify the seafront. The villas here are the same sugared almond shades of pistachio, peach and lemon as those on the Amalfi

Coast, but the paint is timeworn and the balconies are hung with the clashing blue and white stripes of Napoli FC shirts. If you are beguiled by the idea of 'la dolce vita', head for Ischia or the high-end enclave of Capri. But if you want to experience real, raw Italy, cast aside your preconceptions and entrust yourself to the urban sprawl.

It was Goethe who coined the phrase 'See Naples and die', suggesting that no other place could ever compare to the one which sprawls defiantly in

the shadow of an active volcano. The German writer wasn't only enamoured with the way Italy's third largest city carves itself into the Gulf of Naples coastline. Instead, like any affair of the heart, Goethe's admiration for Naples went way beyond aesthetics and everything he loved about the city stands true today, from the exhilarating chaos of the Centro Storico to the imposing mass of Vesuvius and the theatrical locals.

Acquaintance with this wild city gets off to the sweetest of starts in its pasticceria,

where the morning coffee is served *zuccherato* (sweet) and the clamshell *sfogliatelle* hide lemon cream or chocolate centres beneath layer-upon-layer of flaky pastry.

Naples' unique charm takes on various guises in its many neighbourhoods, but nowhere is its magnetism felt more than on the atmospheric streets of the Centro Storico. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is the beating heart of the city, its straight streets still following the grid of ancient Roman and Greek settlements. The city's world-class museums are elsewhere, but the hustle and bustle of the street which splices through Naples is an attraction in itself. The Centro Storico is indicative of the way everyday life is lived here, from beautiful girlfriends riding pillion on speeding Vespas to feisty Neapolitan Nonnas shouting between the balconies. Sitting in the Piazza de Plebiscito is a cinematic experience, bettered only by the addition of a slice or two of Neapolitan pizza with which to enjoy the view.

The unique beauty of an afternoon in Naples is that the city's neighbourhoods are busy not with tourists but with locals. Some rifle through crates of fist-sized tomatoes destined to be whipped into a ragu.

Some put the world to rights with friends, antipasti in their hands and dogs obediently by their feet. Others simply watch, from balconies strewn with washing on the Spaccanapoli's vertical streets or from sandstone doorsteps in hillside districts that take five hundred steps or more to reach.

Neapolitans are passionate about everything. Devoutly religious, there are hundreds of churches in the city and when they aren't worshipping at the altar, locals are lighting candles at street shrines embedded into walls outside their homes. Most pay worship to Madonna, others Diego Maradona.

Food is the city's second religion. Pizza and Naples are one, inseparable. Pizza pilgrimages lead you to an unassuming sand-coloured restaurant front sandwiched between bookstores on the Via Port'Alba. It might not look like much but for pizza fans Antica Pizzeria Port'Alba is everything. Opened in 1830 as the world's first pizzeria, its pizzas provided sustenance for the city's cash-strapped, even offering an option for patrons to pay up to eight days after their meal. Nowadays it nourishes tourists who queue around the block to sample the magic that happens when San Marzano tomato sauce, buffalo mozzarella, extra-virgin olive oil and basil meet on a perfectly charred crust.

Spend an evening in Naples and you'll notice the night owl tendencies of the Neapolitans. Teatime's aperitivo hour means that dinner is a late and long affair. In the local haunts, tables stand empty until at least 8.30pm, at which point friends, family and a combination of the two congregate to feast on plates of insalata caprese and spaghetti alle vongole. Be warned, for once you have dined 'alla Campagna' you will spend a lifetime trying to replicate the dishes, most attempts proving pitiful without tomatoes grown in the soil of Vesuvius and buffalo mozzarella made just a few miles along the coast.

Food and otherwise, Naples is an assault on the senses, but with sight, sound and smell overwhelmed, you will set sail into the Campania sunset knowing that you have seen the real Italy; passionate, welcoming, wild and with a characteristic determination to live life to the fullest.

After a hundred bookings, it is safe to say that Colin is a testament to the power of unwavering customer service.

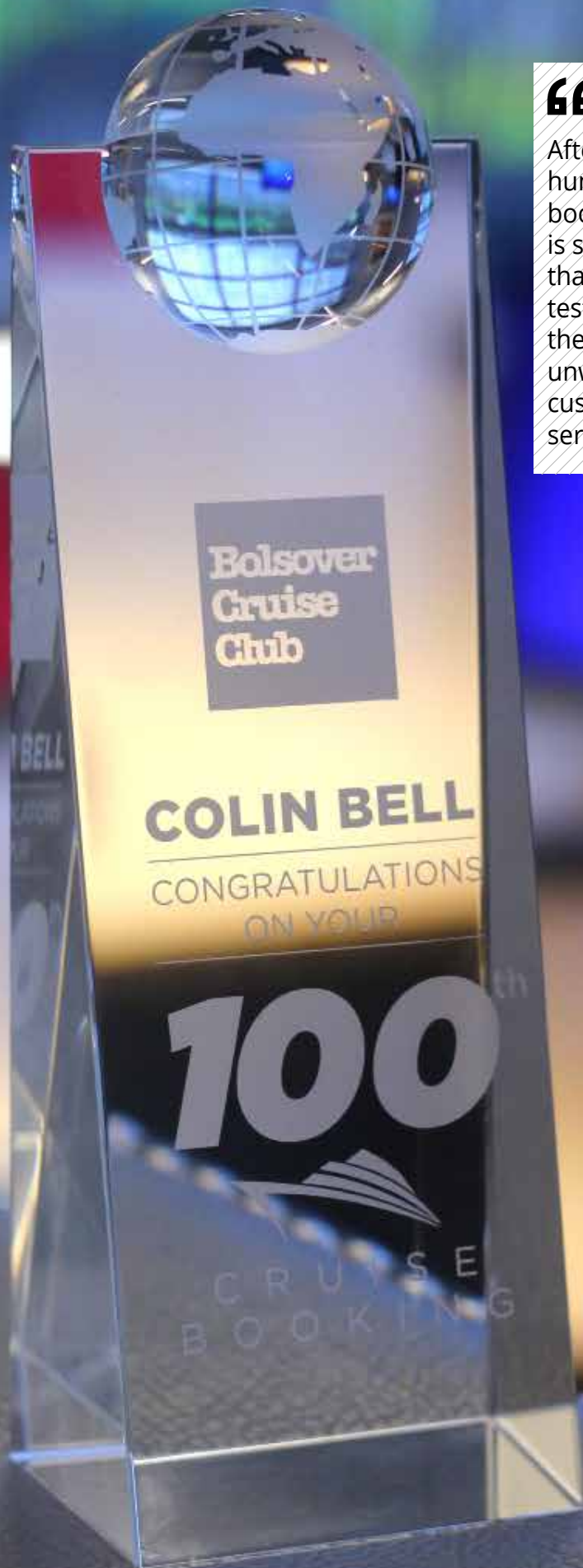

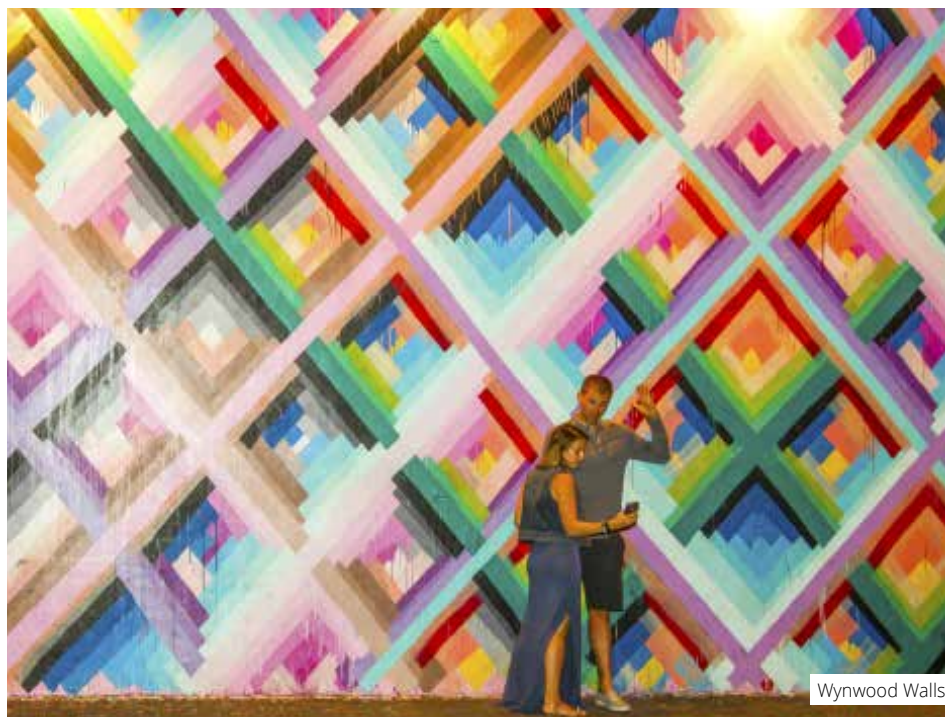
It is hard to get your head around just how much Miami manages to cram into its city borders. From hip Wynwood and its painted walls to art deco Ocean Drive, as historic as it is illuminated. From the sleek Design District to the swampy Everglades and sandy Key West; Miami has it all. The hardest part of holidaying here before or after a cruise departing from Port Everglades or the Port of Miami – two of the busiest cruise ports in the world – is deciding which bits deserve your attention and which will have to wait until next time. And there will be a next time, because once is never enough when it comes to Miami.

Cinematic Miami Beach epitomises the city you're used to seeing on screen. The neighbourhood's emblematic Art Deco District is pretty in pastels during the day and bright with neons at night. The area's Ocean Drive and Collins Avenue are a place to see and be seen whatever the hour, their palm-lined promenades frequented by men in motors and ladies who lunch. When you're done with people watching, take a walk north along 5th Street to the Art Deco District Welcome Centre. Free audio tours will give you a run down on the area's past, which is almost as colourful as its buildings.

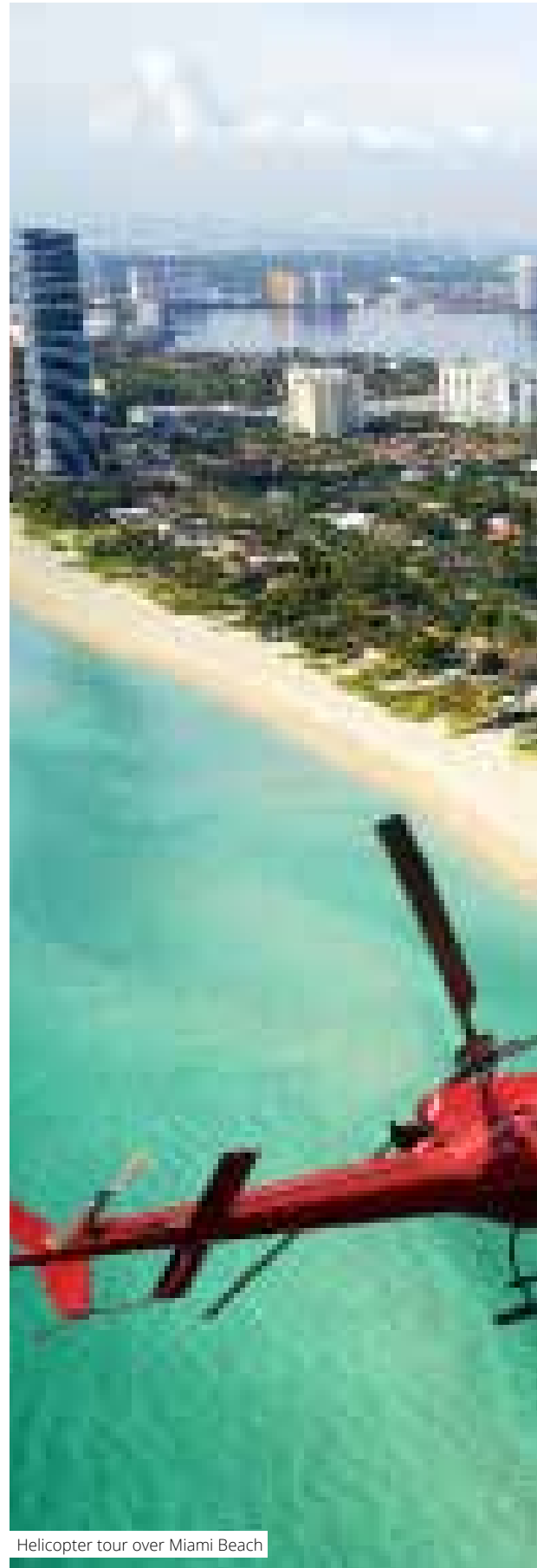
One place where it pays to enlist the services of a local guide who really knows their stuff is Wynwood, a former warehouse district now entirely dedicated to art. This once rundown part of town has been transformed by the power of creativity, the biggest names in graffiti and street art contributing to a landscape of larger-than-life murals.

The Wynwood Walls official tour is led by two of Miami's most-prolific street art stars, Ryan the Wheelbarrow and Pedro AMOS, and offers a fascinating insight into Tony Goldman, the man behind the outdoor art museum, as well as the ever-changing artworks within it. Afterwards, refuel with a home brew and a sausage platter at Wynwood institution, The Butcher Shop, before delving into the surrounding boutiques that sell the wares of local designers.

After Fidel Castro came to power, thousands of Cubans fled to Miami, settling in what is now known as Little Havana. This neighbourhood just west of downtown is small in size but big in personality. Strolling Calle Ocho, with its hand-rolled cigar shops and Latin music emanating from every open window is

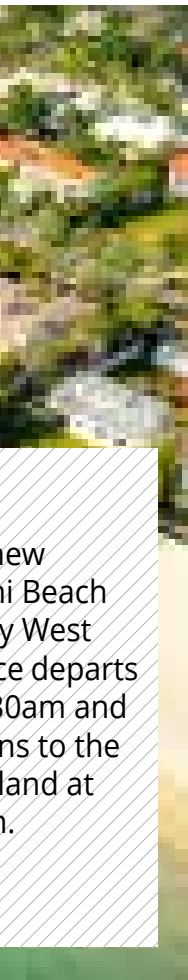

as close as you can get to Cuba without having to cash in your dollars for pesos. Once you've taken the obligatory selfie with the painted roosters outside El Pub, visit the Azucar ice cream parlour for a scoop of Café con Leche. Eat it over the road in Maximo Gomez Park, watching the local gents remonstrate over heated games of dominos.

As the southernmost point in the US, Key West can provide a taste of what's to come in the Caribbean before you set sail or a final fling to soften the blow before you head home, depending on whether you visit pre or post-cruise. If you have already seen everything that Miami and the Everglades have to offer on previous visits, a day out here is never wasted. Sightseeing excursions depart Miami Beach often but the cheapest way to spend a day in Key West is with GoBuses. The new Miami Beach to Key West service departs at 7.30am and returns to the mainland at 11pm, giving you seven hours to enjoy the laidback island oasis in the Gulf. The service runs on state-of-the-art deluxe coaches equipped with air con and Wi-Fi, with tickets costing as little as \$18 return.



The Versace Mansion

Miami caters for every appetite, from the kale-consuming gym bunny to the gluttonous fast food fiend. The destination has evolved to become one of America's big foodie cities, with the country's best chefs no longer shunning Miami for the bright lights of New York or Los Angeles.

In the Design District, Michael Schwartz is leading a culinary renaissance that has helped to transform the area. Those who have cruised with Royal Caribbean may recognise the name; Schwartz is the man behind the meals at 150 Central Park, the acclaimed signature dining venue aboard three of the cruise line's Oasis-class ships. In Miami, Schwartz has revolutionised the foodie scene with his farm-to-table ethos and famously delicious desserts, his three Design District hangouts – Michael's Genuine Food & Drink, The Cypress Room and posh pizza joint Harry's Pizzeria – proving enough to lure locals back to the previously overlooked neighbourhood. Today, it is one of the most impressive locales in the city, a creative hub of food, art and fashion encased in award-winning architecture.



As the one-time home of Gianni Versace, The Villa Casa Casuarina at 1116 Ocean Drive is already one of the most famous addresses in the world. Now fashion fans can get a glimpse inside the Versace mansion without stumping up the hundreds of pounds it costs to spend the night there. Newly-opened restaurant Gianni's brings the Mediterranean to Miami, with tables on the terrace commanding views of the gorgeous Thousand Mosaic Pool and surrounding tropical gardens. It isn't cheap but the expense is worth it to say you have eaten at fashion's most iconic address.

Almost 70% of the population here is Latin and some of Miami's signature flavours have been dictated by the influx of Cuban, Peruvian and Colombian communities that arrived into the city during the 1960s. Nowadays, eating Cuban food in Little Havana is bucket list stuff and there's no better place to oblige than at Versailles. Entirely unrelated to its Parisian namesake, 'The World's Most Famous Cuban Restaurant' has been dishing up surprisingly authentic

Cuban cuisine for almost 50 years. Despite its popularity with tourists and appearance in almost every Miami travel guide, it remains a spot where locals come to chow down, chill out and talk politics.

With Latin, Pan-Asian, Mexican and more on the menu, one could quite easily forget that Miami sits in America's south, home of soul food and epic portions. Located just off Lincoln Road, Yardbird serves up a tasty reminder of your whereabouts with a menu of Southern comfort food. Think beef short-rib, shrimp 'n' grits, fried chicken, cornbread and collard greens and you're on the right lines. Equally all-American is Big Pink, a Miami stalwart that needs no introduction. The stereotypical diner may look like a Barbie playhouse but its vast menu has won the hearts of everyone from celebrities quenching their carb cravings to post-bar patrons in need of something to soak up the alcohol. There aren't many after-effects of one too many mojitos that a big bowl of their special skillet-baked mac 'n' cheese can't cure.

DRINK UP...

Once the sun goes down, things really start to heat up in Miami, where cocktails and Coronas are as much a part of the experience as sun, sand and psychedelic lifeguard towers.

As the sun sets, the party people come out to play. Get a head start on the revelry by embracing the American institution that is happy hour; almost everywhere in the city celebrates clocking off time with cocktails, beers and bar bites that won't break the bank.

South Beach is a hive of happy hour activity and choosing a bargain bar in which to spend those precious two or three hours isn't easy. We like to follow the lead of the locals, a path which inevitably leads to Monty's Sunset. Located in South Pointe, this cool and carefree hangout boasts the best sunset views in the whole of South Florida. Find out what time the sun will set on the Monty's Sunset website (<http://www.montyssobe.com/>) and plan your visit to coincide with the arrival of blood orange skies over Miami Beach Marina. Unlike some South Beach hotspots, the prime views here aren't served with a side of snootiness; in no time at all you'll be tucking into Florida Keys crab with your bare hands and clinking drinks with locals in the tiki hut.

It's safe to say that you are sorely missing out if tacos don't factor into your Miami stay and the only thing better than tucking into the Mexican mainstay is knowing that it only cost you \$2 to do so. Set aside another \$3 for a draft beer too and make your way to Bodega, a seemingly unextraordinary taco shop on South Beach's 16th Street. Avert your gaze from the fine taco selection long enough to reach the secret door at the rear of Bodega and you'll find yourself in a not-so-secret speakeasy that is far enough off the beaten path to avoid being overrun with tourists, yet easy enough to find without going too far out of your way. Happy hour runs 6-8pm every day in the two-storey bar, where Cuban interiors and Mexican flavours provide the perfect prelude to your night.

Of course, there's more to Miami than happy hour. Ball & Chain in Little Havana once welcomed Billie Holiday and Nat King Cole to its stage, putting on a show after hours back when African-American performers were still expected to be out of Miami Beach by midnight. The bar has been restored to look just as it did in its 1930s heyday, its pineapple-shaped stage trodden by the lyrical cream of the crop who are dead set on keeping the tradition for live jazz beneath the tropical palms alive. Order a Mojito Criollo and make yourself comfortable for the show from 6pm Thursday to Saturday.

If you're keen to check out Biscayne Bay from above, Sugar is the very best of all Miami's many rooftop bars. Located on the 40th floor of the EAST Miami hotel in the Brickell District, Sugar is making waves with its Asian-fusion tapas and craft cocktails. Testament to its success, the venue was recently recognised by Condé Nast as one of the top ten rooftop bars in the whole of the US.

Last but not least, it isn't often that we recommend a visit to the local hostel. However, Miami's Freehand Hostel is hiding a secret cocktail haunt in its midst. Broken Shaker serves the best cocktails in the city bar none, its imaginative mixologists knocking up quirky concoctions with herbs picked from a courtyard garden. They have board games too, which is always a winner in our eyes.

BREADSTICKS

1kg plain flour
350g unsalted butter
15g fresh yeast
30g sugar
15g salt
150ml ice-cold water
1 egg
Coarse salt

- 1 Mix flour, butter, yeast, sugar and salt in a food processor into a crumble. With the motor running, slowly add water until dough forms.
- 2 Shape dough into a flat loaf, wrap in cling film and place in the fridge for 1 hour.
- 3 Remove dough from the fridge and heat the oven 180°C.
- 4 On a floured work surface, roll the dough until 1/3" thick and trim the sides to make straight.
- 5 Slice the dough lengthwise into 1/3" thick breadsticks.
- 6 Carefully transfer the breadsticks to a baking tray lined with greaseproof paper.
- 7 Brush the dough with egg wash and sprinkle with coarse salt.
- 8 Bake in the oven for 10-12 minutes until golden and crisp.
