

GREEN LIGHT FOR NEW LIVERPOOL CRUISE TERMINAL

LANS FOR A new £50 million cruise terminal in Liverpool have been given the go ahead.

The plan by Liverpool City Council would see redundant buildings at Princes Jetty on the River Mersey dismantled and replaced with a new terminal facility incorporating passport control, a lounge, café, taxi rank and pick up point. Further budget would be set aside for upgrading the roads around the terminal and creating a link road to the waterfront.

More than 60 ships and 120,000 passengers passed through the existing terminal in 2017 and the council expects the planned project to see the numbers grow significantly. Head of city assets, Angie Redhead, said: "This is a major step forward for the multimillion-pound project, which is one of the city's most important regeneration schemes.

"We've seen the benefits of the existing cruise terminal, which brings in around \pounds 8million each year to the local economy. This figure will increase significantly when we have the ability to welcome the next generation of superliners all year round."

Detailed plans for the project, which would create thousands of jobs in the city, will be submitted by Liverpool City Council later this year.

NEW PRIVATE ISLANDS FOR ROYAL CARIBBEAN

Royal Caribbean International has unveiled plans to launch a series of exclusive private islands in Asia, Australia and the Caribbean.

CocoCay in the Bahamas was the first island announced as part of the Perfect Day Island Collection, with passengers set to visit on Royal Caribbean ships departing from New York, Maryland and Florida.

Already a feature on the year-round itineraries of Enchantment of the Seas and Majesty of the Seas, the island will undergo an extensive \pounds 142million renovation, introducing new features including the largest freshwater pool in the Caribbean, the tallest waterslide in North America and a helium hot air balloon ride offering views across the Bahamas.

Work on CocoCay will begin in September and is expected to be completed in 2019.



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A NEED FOR

Ayrton Senna's recordbreaking McLaren is auctioned off this month, it will be at Bonhams in Monaco. Because, where else? It's 25 years since the Brazilian ace won his final Monaco Grand Prix, his sixth win in a row in a place for which he had become something of a poster boy, yet the world's second-smallest country remains the global epicentre of motor racing.

AYSAYERS ARGUE THAT the streets of this petite principality are wholly unsuitable for the supercharged race cars of today, the straights too short for such speeds and the corners too tight. Yet they have echoed with the roar of engines since 1929 and the prestige of the occasion means that they will likely continue to do so each May for years to come. This is the Monaco Grand Prix. Formula 1 fan or otherwise, this is the race that everyone has heard of and it is the one we all want to see.

Racing runs through the veins of Monaco. The principality's tax haven status and 300 days of sunshine a year means many drivers have made it home, including Lewis Hamilton and Nico Rosberg, who was raised here and is now seeing out his retirement just yards away from the track he dominated for three successive years between 2013 and 2015.

Displayed outside the swish Fairmont Hotel is a matt-black plaque proclaiming the road outside – The Fairmont Hairpin – to be 'The World's Most Famous Bend'. It doesn't exaggerate. Underfoot, black rubber stripes still mark the red and white curbs, though it's hard to say whether they were left behind by Lewis Hamilton or a local taxi driver.

While the tyre tracks might suggest otherwise, the Monaco Grand Prix isn't especially speedy. The aforementioned Fairmont Hairpin – turn six of 19 – is the slowest corner in F1. The track is a tight squeeze throughout, drivers brushing past barriers with mere millimetres to spare as they do battle at speeds of up to 185mph, every millisecond precious on those 78 laps. Such a test of skill and endurance thrills spectators and sees it considered part of the 'Triple Crown' of motorsport, joining the Indy 500 and the Le Mans 24 Hours in a trio of the world's most prestigious races.

Monaco has a glamour that is hard to overhype at any time of year but come Grand Prix weekend the stakes are even higher. By the time revellers have arrived in town, six weeks of hard work has transformed its streets; 20 miles of railings assembled, 3,600 safety tyres stacked around the track perimeter and 1,100 tonnes of grandstand erected. Now, it is time to party. Port Hercules is awash with a sea of gleaming super yachts well ahead of the race, the champagne spraying days before a single car has crossed the finish line. As you'd expect from such a high-end enclave, front row seats to the crowning glory of the Formula 1 calendar don't come cheap, with hotel rooms routinely commanding upwards of \pounds 1,000-a-night during race weekend and selling out almost a year in advance for the most part. And therein lies the reason why cruising is such a tempting proposition.




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

Grand Prix voyages tend to offer the glorious locales of Palma de Mallorca and Barcelona as an opening welcome, going on to dabble in Italian ports such as Rome and Sardinia, before cruising the Mediterranean's pristine blue waters to the Côte d'Azur and docking in Nice or Villefranche for the main event. With sun almost guaranteed on the mid-May sailings, it's a perfect compromise for couples who don't particularly share a love of racing. While one partner watches the drama unfurl trackside, the other can be topping up their tan on the sands of a private beach club or flexing the plastic at Hermès and Chanel in the Place du Casino. You could even meet in the middle, lunching at Café de Paris to watch the gentry come and go at the Casino de Monte-Carlo across the street. On the flipside, Grand Prix cruises tend to unite solo travellers too, the dining rooms seeing an increase in tables of eight, strangers bonded by a shared love of motorsports and the thrill of the race.



There is no one-size-fits-all when it comes to cruising and that ethos stands strong for Grand Prix sailings too. Itineraries that are meticulously timed to arrive in town for the big race are the constant, but each cruise line has their own way of doing things en route. Star Clippers deliver a nostalgic voyage under canvas on their Monaco Grand Prix Final sailings, while Azamara Club Cruises will take in not one but two of the Riviera's biggest events on their unique Grand Prix and Cannes cruise. The ever-popular itinerary is already on sale for next year, departing 18 May 2019 with fares from $f_{4,160pp}$. Fred Olsen's F1 itineraries cruise straight from Dover to the heart of the action on their Sun,

Sea & Monaco Grand Prix sailings, while P&O Cruises promise British hospitality in the sun on their 7 and 14-night roundtrip Mediterranean fly-cruises from Malta to the French Riviera. With fares starting from less than the cost of your hotel in Monaco alone, and including a week or two in the sun plus plenty of good food, it makes perfect sense.



The Monaco Grand Prix race on Sunday coincides with the end of the Cannes Film Festival and an influx of high-profile attendees only adds to the glamour. The final wave of a chequered flag signals both the end of the race and the beginning of the after-parties, the harbour alive with the kind of sizzling atmosphere that could only come after such an adrenaline-fuelled weekend.

Come Monday, anchors are raised and the mega-yachts charter a course to the next billionaire's bolthole. It'll take three weeks to remove mile-upon-mile of grandstand, tyres and barriers, putting Monaco back to normal. Until next year.



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

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DON'T MISS...

PANISH POET Federico García Larca declared Las Ramblas to be 'the only reet in the world I wish would ever end'. Stretching from ne monument of Christopher folumbus to the Plaça Catalunya, ne tree-lined boulevard cuts brough the heart of the city. from the over-zealous waiters buting menus with English ranslations to the human ratues and street performers

everyone's inner child with their poses and party tricks, Las Ramblas is a feast for the senses and an inevitable part of any visit to Barcelona.



One of the most notable buildings along Las Ramblas is La Boqueria. There are 40 or more food markets in Barcelona, each neighbourhood has its own, but only La Boqueria has evolved to become an attraction in its own right. Arrive after lunchtime and it is manic; beat the crowds and it is magical. Eat with your eyes at food stalls piled with pouting fish, fat prawns and creamy slabs of goats' cheese. With an appetite earned, it is on to the unassuming hole-in-the-wall style eateries, family-owned for generations, their Catalonian specialities served up to hungry diners perched on high stools. Bar Pinotxo gets our vote. A mere slither of a place, its butifarra and garbanzos have earned it a reputation as one of the tastiest tapas joints around. There's no menu as such, just ask Juanito in the maroon waistcoat to tell you the dishes of the day.

A stone's throw from Las Ramblas is where many of Barcelona's visitors first enter the childlike imagination of Antoni Gaudí, the Catalan creator who left the city awash with colour. Casa Batlló stands proud on the Passeig de Gràcia, and its eclectic façade and swirling interiors have been described by Lonely Planet as 'Gaudí at his hallucinatory best'. Be there for 8.30am and you'll be one of a lucky few to explore the house without the crowds. Gaudí's gloriously gaudy creations litter the city, from standalones like La Pedrera, with its sculpted limestone curves, to Park Güell, a toy town of giant mosaic lizards and Hansel and Gretel houses with red mushroom roofs. Gaudí himself called the park home for his last 20 years, residing in the spired terracotta house at its centre. Sagrada Família, Gaudí's most famous work and that which he considered to be his greatest, remains unfinished after well over a hundred years. That said, the subtle scaffolding that surrounds parts of the Roman Catholic church doesn't even slightly detract from its stop-youin-your-tracks grandeur. Make sure you book your tour tickets online to avoid disappointment; 4.5 million people visit each year and tickets are strictly limited to avoid overcrowding.

Gaudí isn't the only artist to have left his mark on Barcelona. Joan Miró was born in the city and he relished the idea of his work being used to welcome those who arrived by air, land and sea. Three works of art serve this purpose: a giant mural on the façade of the airport's Terminal 2B, a circular mosaic underfoot on Las Ramblas for those making their way from ships to the city centre, and finally the Woman and Bird sculpture close to Barcelona's main train station.







More artistic inspirations are afoot in Barcelona's atmospheric Gothic Quarter, where medieval alleyways twist and turn to reveal sheltered squares and hidden cloisters. The Old Town radiates out from the Santa Eulalia Cathedral, with attractions such as the Church of Santa Maria del Pi, the Jewish district of El Call and the 13th century Palau Aguilar, home of the Museu Picasso, all in the vicinity. Make time too to visit the Museu d'Historia de Barcelona, where excavations in the 1920s unearthed 4,000 square metres of Roman streets and villas that are now encased beneath glass floors.



If you have already ticked Barcelona's big-ticket attractions off your list, there are plenty of other options besides. Sun yourself on Barceloneta Beach or join the locals on the quieter Bogatell Beach. If you're prepared to invest 20 minutes on a train ride, you'll be rewarded with near empty sands and beach shacks galore at Castelldefels Beach just outside the city.

The beaches of the Costa Brava are well within reach of the city, with Excursions Barcelona's (*excursionsbarcelona.com*) full-day 'Kayaking & Snorkelling Tour' making a scenic two-hour trip kayaking along the coast. When you're all paddled out, there's the option to make your acquaintance with the local marine life, including octopus and moray eels, before tucking into a picnic on the beach.

If vintage motors are more up your street, With Locals (*withlocals.com*) have a totally new way for you to see the city, by way of a World War II sidecar. Barcelona local, Nuria, will give you an insider's rundown on the city's hidden gems, history and culture on a ride that takes you from Las Ramblas to Barceloneta Beach, Plaça Catalunya and more, all while giving your legs a rest.

Barcelona with kids is a breeze. Camp Nou is a mecca for die-hard football fans and the city's various hop-on-hopoff sightseeing buses stop right outside Europe's biggest stadium. If you're lucky enough to be in town for gameday and plan on buying tickets, bear in mind that La Liga can reschedule matches up to 14 days prior, so nothing is set in stone until then. Guided tours of the famous stadium are available on days without a game scheduled and you'll not only come face-to-face with the club's five Champions League trophies but also get the chance to walk in the players' tunnel, sit on the team bench and make yourself at home in the first team dugout.

If the children are antsy after a day or two at sea, you'll appreciate the close proximity of L'Aquarium Barcelona to Port Vell. Without doubt, this is one of the best things to do with kids in Barcelona, with the aquarium being one of Europe's largest with 11,000 animals representing some 450 species. The Oceanarium is a highlight, its transparent tunnel creating an 80-metre underwater walkway as sandbar and sand tiger sharks prowl overhead.





REGULARS

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ARCELONA has something to satisfy every appetite and budget. There are cheap eats at modest market stands and Michelin-starred restaurants run by some of the most respected and renowned chefs in the world. You can eat like a local at rustic bodegas or dine with high society at waterfront restaurants where the glassware gleams almost as much

as the yachts in the harbour.

Market restaurants are a huge part of Barcelona's identity and while La Boqueria has its fair share, in-the-know locals tend to leave it to the tourists and head for little-known haunts in their local barrio instead. The Mercat de Santa Caterina is a stone's throw from the Sagrada Família, yet you'll still find a three-course lunch with the freshest fish in the city for just €12 at Bar Joan, with another euro getting you a glass of decent local wine. Building buffs will recognise the market by its undulating pixelated roof, the result of a huge makeover in 2005. Food tours are hands down the best way to see a new city. You'll see the sights, get the inside track from a local and sample the specialities that tend to be easily overlooked in favour of the easy to decipher English menus touted along Las Ramblas. The Barcelona Taste (*thebarcelonataste.com*) is thinking outside the box with its new tapas tour of Poble Sec, a neighbourhood that has become the place to be for aspiring young chefs. The 3-hour tour promises food galore as you uncover the neighbourhood's up and coming foodie scene that has been built around traditional Catalan dishes with a contemporary twist.

Finally, if you'd rather dine close to the ship, Port Vell has endless options. La Mar Salada is a highlight of the portfacing strip along Passeig de Joan de Borbó. The paella here is exceptional but so too is a €17.50 set lunch menu featuring the catch of the day, collected by owner Albert each morning from the nearby harbour fish auction.









DRINK UP.

NY TOUR THAT combines food and wine is a clear winner in our eyes. Join Foodie & Tours (*foodieandtours.com*) in beautiful Alella, just 20 minutes outside Barcelona. One for the romantics, the rural Catalan winery with phenomenal views over the Mediterranean Sea is a breath of fresh air from Barcelona's intoxicating

hustle and bustle. You'll tour the vineyards and 14th century estate, before laying out your picnic blanket and delving into a basket full of artisan tomato bread, sausage, cheese and fresh fruit, all washed down with a bottle of Bouquet d'A Blanc.

Back in the 16th century, the residences along Carrer Montcada housed Barcelona's most influential families. Nowadays, the moody old Ribera district hosts some of the city's most sultry flamenco performances. Palau Dalmases Espai Barroc is located in a former Gothic palace, the period features and antique furniture building an atmospheric backdrop for the highly-charged performances.



Barcelona offers plenty in the way of rooftop bars promising cocktails with a view. They range from the high-end, haute cuisine-offering Arola, with a 700-bottle wine repository and a contemporary tapas menu serving up veal tartare and octopus with yuca chips, to the tranquil La Terrassa. Located atop the Villa Emilia in the Eixample district, the bar offers calm



amidst the hustle and bustle, with live music and Thursday/Friday barbecues attracting a local crowd and a chilled vibe in which to sip your vermouth.



BRISBANE

With 261 days of sun each year, Brisbane has a reputation as Australia's sunniest city. A day here can incorporate anything from cultural highs found at the Queensland Gallery of Modern Art to cuddling koalas at the Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary and soaking up the rays at Streets Beach, the only inner-city man-made beach in Australia. Located on the South Bank Parklands, the beach and its surrounding shops and restaurants, plus the Wheel of Brisbane attraction, offer plenty to keep you fed, watered and entertained for an entire day.

Every great city has a zoo but Brisbane's Australia Zoo is something special, designed to be the best wildlife conservation centre on the planet. Seeing animals from around the world, including some of the most endangered on earth, roaming in vast open spaces under the Australian sun is a joy.

CAIRNS

Cairns is Australia's gateway to the great outdoors, with the Great Barrier Reef and the Daintree Rainforest, the oldest tropical rainforest in the world, on its doorstep. There are far too many natural attractions here to tick off your list in a single visit but that just means you have an excuse to return. A trek through the 135-million-year-old rainforest a couple of hours north of the city is a good starting point, followed by a visit to the vibrant mountain village of Kuranda. That said, it is difficult to ignore the pull of the Great Barrier Reef. There are countless excursions and tours to take you there; see the underwater action on a half-day diving trip or get a bird's-eye view on a flightseeing tour.

DARWIN

Darwin's waterfront is home to the usual contemporary cafes and hip bars, but it is aboriginal roots and prehistoric predators that set Australia's northernmost capital apart. Over a quarter of the Northern Territory population hail from aboriginal communities and Darwin displays aboriginal artwork with fierce pride in its galleries and museums. If your itinerary allows, take the ferry for a tour of the Tiwi Islands, home to the Tiwi Aboriginal people. Cut off from the mainland aboriginal societies, the Tiwi people developed their own unique language and culture.

If it is crocodile encounters you're looking for, Darwin doesn't disappoint. Cruise Adelaide River to see them in the wild or face your fears in the Cage of Death at Crocosaurus Cove, suspended in a clear plastic tube as some of the largest saltwater crocodiles on the planet circle in search of their next meal.

NEWCASTLE


Don't let the name fool you; there isn't a chicken parmo in sight here. As the gateway to the Hunter Valley wine region, Newcastle has become a permanent fixture on itineraries and despite its diminutive size, the city can give any other Australian port a run for its money. Its city centre is surrounded by eight beaches, from the popular Mereweather to Bogey Hole, the natural pool hand-carved into rocks by convicts in 1820. You can also take your pick of beaches on the Bathers Way coastal path, a scenic walk from Nobbys Beach to Glenrock Reserve that also takes in historical sites such as Fort Scratchley.

Newcastle sits on the migratory path for humpback whales between June and October and a boat trip with NOVA



Cruises (novacruises.com.au) offers the chance to see them in all their glory on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays. With your feet back on dry land, grab a late lunch at one of the buzzy restaurants that line the Honeysuckle Foreshore.







ADELAIDE

Once nicknamed the 'City of Churches', Adelaide has cast off its stuffy reputation like an old coat to become known as one of the most energetic cities in Australia. The South Australia capital comes alive during festival season from mid-February to mid-March, but it's a charmer all year round with a tasty restaurant scene, lively rooftop bars and golden beaches that rival any of the most famous in Oz. The city's free bike hire scheme makes seeing the sights on two wheels a breeze. Enjoy a scenic morning cycle beside the Torrens River and sip a flat white at Adelaide Central Market, or trade two wheels for four and head into the Barossa Valley, where you can sip your birth year vintage at the Seppeltsfield Estate, one of the region's many wineries.

ITH MORE THAN 10,000 beaches to choose from, it's little surprise that over 85% of Australians live on the coast, taking their pick from wild, windswept coves to tranquil stretches of silky sand. There isn't a 'best beaches in the world' list that Oz doesn't appear on and if you're visiting by ship you'll have plenty of chances to sample the best of the bunch. Sydney alone has a hundred beaches or more, from Bondi Beach – Australia's icon and a mecca for surfers – to Manly Beach, the Sydneysider's favourite which despite being just five miles from the city via a 30-minute ferry from the Circular Quay feels a million miles away from the hustle and bustle. If you're torn between the two, the sightseeing opportunities of the Harbour Bridge and Opera House from the ferry give Manly Beach the edge and save you spending on the tourist boat trips too.

As the jump off point from the Queensland coast for the Great Barrier Reef and with an average of 274 sunny days a year, the Whitsundays absolutely have to appear on your itinerary.



Ships tend to call at one of two ports; Airlie Beach is the main gateway to Australia's northeast coast, while Hamilton Island welcomes smaller ships straight into the heart of the Whitsundays.

The 74 islands are largely uninhabited and it's hard to think of a better way to spend a day than sailing between them. Gin-clear waters coming in at a balmy 26 degrees make dipping a toe in the sea inevitable and there's nowhere better to do so than on Whitehaven Beach. Even in a land of sands like Australia, Whitehaven stands out by a country mile with its pure white beach and sea turtles that surface just metres from the shoreline, just two of the many reasons you'll consider giving everything up and moving here for good, voluntarily marooned on a beach that routinely ranks in the world's top five.




Finally, it isn't a beach but as far as romance goes, it is impossible not to feel the love as you gaze down over Heart Reef with your dearly beloved by your side. If you're planning on popping the question, this is the place to do it. While they can no longer land on the heartshaped atoll, seaplanes and helicopters from Airlie Beach or Hamilton Island will circle it on an hour-long aerial sojourn, hovering long enough for you to slip on the sparkler and pop the cork on the champagne.

Z IS AS FAMOUS for its natural beauty as it is for its expat-attracting cities in the sun. The snorkelling and scuba diving here is better than anywhere else on earth, and while we can't deny the presence of a natural born predator or two, the fearsome great whites are balanced out by the cuddly koalas and it's the latter that you're more likely to come across. From swathes of ancient emerald rainforest to fire-red mountains and the deepest blue seas, there's nowhere quite so wild in the world.

The Great Barrier Reef seems like a pretty predictable place to start but there is no other natural wonder in Australia or



elsewhere so emblematic, or indeed so large. Similar in size to Finland, or equivalent to 70 million football pitches, it is the largest living structure on earth and the only living structure that can be seen from space, radiating from the Queensland coastline in a haze of blues. The 500,000-year-old reef is huge and so too is the diversity of life that calls it home. 10% of the world's fish species swim here, plus 10,000 odd-looking dugongs, 30 whale and dolphin species, 134 sharks and rays and many more. The corals are a hive of activity and if your cruise itinerary doesn't allow at least a little time to explore them, you're missing out on one of the best experiences of your life. If seeing the Great Barrier Reef is a priority (and it

should be), choose your cruise line carefully; some merely offer views of the reef as you sail by on bigger ships, while others such as Princess Cruises deliver more intensive experiences such as flightseeing tours from Airlie Beach or guided snorkelling and diving excursions from Cairns and Port Douglas.

For all its impressive underwater action, Australia offers more of the same wonder above ground. Dominating the heart of the Red Centre, Uluru or 'Ayers Rock' is unmissable, a great 348m monolith glowing scarlet red against the sunrise skies. The rock recently attracted press when the board of the Uluru-Kata Tjuta National





Park voted to ban people from climbing it, something the site's Aboriginal owners have requested for many years. The ban comes into place on 26 October 2019 but in the meantime, a sign at the base of the rock reads: "We, the traditional Anangu owners, have this to say. Uluru is sacred in our culture, a place of great knowledge. Under our traditional law, climbing is not permitted. This is our home. Please don't climb."

With an outback location about as far from the coast as you can get, Uluru may appear out of reach for cruisers but land tours to the area are very often combined with Australasia itineraries. Both Holland America Line and Princess Cruises offer pre-or postcruise overland tours right to the centre of the island continent, so you can really make the most of your time down under.

While Uluru may be the icon, the sandstone cliffs, canyons and caves found in the Blue Mountains make the region a real Aussie highlight. Excursions depart from nearby Sydney and they'll take a hefty chunk of your time in the city, but the scenery is spectacular and the air is gloriously fresh. Ride the Scenic Railway, known as the world's steepest incline railway, catch sight of the Three Sisters rock formation from the Scenic Skyway and take the Scenic Cableway over the Jamison Valley. Most excursions call at the Featherdale Wildlife Park too, home to a private collection of more than 2,200 animals. Hands-on encounters here encourage you to get to know the locals,



from feeding a kangaroo to cosying up to a koala.

Australia isn't short of places to pet the wildlife and there's a real focus on the conservation of species found nowhere else in the world but there. There are zoos galore, including the Steve Irwin-founded Australia Zoo, created by the Irwin family to be the biggest wildlife conservation facility in the world. Sanctuaries are scattered across the continent, including the award-winning Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary with its 103 koala bears, and conservation areas on Kangaroo Island. All have been carefully developed to create a Noah's Ark for endangered wildlife, from 6ft-tall red kangaroos to the famously elusive platypus. As far as sharks are concerned, it's safe to go in the water; while great whites and other shark species are undeniably present around these parts, you'd have to be pretty unlucky to come face-to-face with one. Unless you want to, of course; shark diving is big business here, with Port Lincoln the top pick for Jaws enthusiasts.

From the smallest of spaces; the cowboy playing a full-size piano in lifts across the ship or a guitarist performing incredibly expressive flamenco in





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






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Confession no. 1;



Something that had made us nervous beforehand was the size of the cabins. I'm almost 5'11", my husband is 6'5". We are not small people, so concern over fitting into and sleeping in a cabin for two nights was high. We needn't have worried. Our standard outside cabin (no upgrades here) was incredibly spacious, with huge picture windows, a dressing area and a massive bed.

We went straight out to explore the ship, which was gorgeous. Lots of space, multiple pools, bars, restaurants and brilliantly; no crowds, anywhere. Which was a theme for the weekend. We never struggled to sit down in a bar, or on a deck, there was always space for us. Seriously, I'd jump around corners on the Saturday night expecting to find 100s of people queueing for the bar, or sniding up a corridor. It never happened. Don't get me wrong, it didn't feel like we had the entire ship to ourselves, but I was infinitely more relaxed than I am on most holidays. And I challenge anyone to find a more heart-lifting sight than a promenade deck stretched out before you.















And so to the food and Confession no. 5;

I'm known for being greedy. I'm one of seven and growing up, if you didn't eat fast, you didn't eat, which had the effect of making eating somewhat competitive – could I measure up?! Combined with the pre-cruise warnings that I would need stretchy trousers by the end of our trip I had very high expectations.

We ate both evenings in the speciality restaurants: The Beach House on Friday and the fabulous Sindhu on Saturday night. Both wonderful, with Sindhu standing out. Each dish was beautifully presented, with top-quality ingredients and attentive but not intrusive service. All elegantly delivered to our table despite a bit of a roll of the ship in the Channel. My husband enjoyed it so much that he's been casually stalking Atul Kochhar's restaurants since we got home, trying to work out which ones he can visit as he travels round the country for work.

And to my final confession. I loved it. Both the little things, like the turndown service and pillow chocolates, to the bigger things like the elegant feeling of being on a cruise ship and consistent table service – I miss table service! I'll never be a 'joiner', an evening entertainment aficionado or a lover of the formal evening. But that's OK, because now I know a cruise can be whatever you want it to be. With amazing destinations thrown in. Which is pretty awesome.

Jamie, river cruising in Vietnam and Cambodia has never been more popular. Why does it work so well in this part of the world?

The beauty of river cruising is that it takes you through the heart of the destination. We always say that while oceans take you to countries, rivers take you through them and this is never truer than on the Mekong. Cruising the Mekong enables exploration of places a little more off the beaten track, so smaller towns and villages can be discovered which wouldn't normally be on a Vietnam and Cambodia itinerary using another type of transport. The infrastructure in some of these areas also means that travel by road isn't always straightforward, which gives river cruising a huge advantage as you can move location without the hassle of traffic and bumpy roads. This benefit is combined with the fact that the scenery you see whilst cruising is a highlight in itself and you can watch the world drift by whilst relaxing on the sundeck, your balcony or in the cool, air-conditioned comfort of the lounge or stateroom.



Have you seen a shift in the average age range of guests on Mekong itineraries, compared to other river cruise destinations such as Europe?

We do find that our Mekong guests are a little younger than our average, however I think age is a little misleading as a gauge. Our guests in both Asia and in Europe share a spirit of adventure and desire to explore the destinations visited. This is why our selection of included shore excursions in the majority of the ports of call that we visit is so attractive to them.





What was the highlight of your own cruise through Vietnam and Cambodia with AmaWaterways?

Getting to know the local people was the highlight for me. Our onboard guides who travel from port to port not only accompanied me on the shore excursions to destinations that they came from and knew incredibly well, but they also give you an insight into their own history, their families and how they live. The same is the case with the ship's crew, who I came to know really well over the course of the cruise. 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Cambodia has a fraught recent history. How do AmaWaterways acknowledge and honour this in the way they visit both its towns and historical sites?

It's incredibly important to recognise what occurred in Cambodia and we do ensure our guests have the option to learn more about its troubled history. In Phnom Penh, we visit The Killing Fields and Tuol Sleng S21 detention centre (also known as the Genocide Museum). Our local guides have family who were affected by the acts of the Khmer Rouge so both sites are visited with the utmost respect. Although it is difficult, I personally feel it's a very worthwhile experience and would encourage people to learn more by seeing these places.

What is the most common misconception about cruising the Mekong?

I'm not sure there is a common misconception, but I know that people are often deterred from travelling to Vietnam and Cambodia because they are worried about travelling to more off the beaten track and underdeveloped areas and being generally out of their comfort zone. Cruising enables you to take the infrastructure with you, giving you a homely, friendly atmosphere, so helps to provide all of the comforts a first-time explorer of Asia needs.



What would you say to anyone who is considering a Mekong river cruise without a post-cruise stay in Siem Reap?

Reconsider! Angkor is a truly remarkable place with some amazing sites. It's also not just about Angkor Wat which tends to be the first temple that people consider. There are hundreds of individual sites around the ancient city, many of which are even more spectacular. Siem Reap (the base for exploring Angkor) is also a great city with excellent hotels, restaurants and bustling night markets.

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RECREATE THE UNMISTAKABLE FLAVOURS OF ATUL KOCHHAR'S SINDHU AT HOME.

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INGREDIENTS (SERVES 4)

600g boneless lamb rump or neck fillet 2.5cm piece of fresh ginger 6 green cardamom pods 3 garlic cloves 11/2 tbsp vegetable oil 4 cloves 3 tbsp onion paste 1 tbsp ground coriander 1 tsp red chilli powder, or to taste 1 tsp garam masala 1 tsp ground turmeric ¹/₄ tsp ground black pepper 250ml water, plus an extra 2 tsp small pinch of saffron threads 2 tbsp Greek-style yogurt fresh coriander leaves

METHOD

1. Assemble all the ingredients and equipment. You'll need a large heavy-based, non-stick saucepan with a lid.

2. Cut the lamb into bite-sized pieces, trimming and discarding any fat. Peel and finely chop the ginger. Lightly crush the cardamom pods to release the seeds. Peel and thinly slice the garlic.

3. Heat the oil over a medium-high heat. Add the cardamom pods with the seeds and the cloves and stir until they crackle. Add the ginger and garlic; stir, making sure the garlic doesn't over-brown.

> 4. Add the onion paste and stir for 30 seconds until it begins to 'loosen'. Turn the heat to very low and stir in ground coriander, chilli powder, garam masala, turmeric and black pepper. Stir for 30 seconds – 1 minute.

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5. Stir in the lamb, increase the heat to high and stir until it is browned on all sides and coated in the spice mixture. Watch closely so nothing burns. Stir in 250ml of water and the saffron. Salt and bring to the boil, stirring.

6. Reduce the heat, cover the pan and leave the lamb to simmer for 10 minutes or until tender. Top up the liquid, if necessary, so the lamb is always submerged.

7. Mix the yogurt and 2 tsp of water. Rinse and finely chop enough coriander leaves to make about 2 tbsp. Squeeze 2 tsp of lemon juice.

8. When the lamb is tender, stir the yogurt mixture into the pan. Add the lemon juice and season with salt, if necessary, then stir in the chopped coriander to serve.
